### Register for AP Computer Science Principles at Jump Start Super Summer Institute

The deadline to register for the AP® Computer Science Principles session at the 2017 Jump Start Super Summer Institute (SSI) has been extended to May 12, 2017. This session is new to SSI this year and will explore the computational thinking practices and the components of the curriculum framework, including the big ideas, enduring understandings, learning objectives, and essential knowledge statements. ### **Temporary Authority to Teach Waiver**

Based upon feedback from school system leaders, and upon recommendation from the Department, BESE approved a waiver of policy relative to Temporary Authority to Teach (TAT) extensions at its April meeting. The one-year, non-renewable, non-standard teaching certificate authorizes an individual to teach while pursuing the Praxis exam scores required for entrance into a post-baccalaureate teacher preparation program.

The new waiver allows the Teacher Certification Appeals Council (TCAC) to consider appeals relative to TAT extensions through July 2018, provided there is evidence that the teacher made a good faith effort to pass the required exams, met the standards of effectiveness, is recommended by the employing LEA and will continue to be employed, and is teaching in a demonstrated shortage area. TCAC will begin hearing appeals relative to TAT extensions this summer. Please contact your school system for more information about these waivers.

## FINALIZING TEACHER EVALUATIONS FOR 2016-2017

### **End-of-Year Conversations: Principals and Teachers**

End-of-year conversations between principals and teachers should center on these questions:

- What is the attainment level for your student learning targets?
- What changes in practice took place this year based on feedback from observations?
- What opportunities and resources are available as we prepare for next year?

# Curriculum Verification and Results (CVR) Reporting Portal
