2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA)

FBI New Orleans, The Tulane University Police Department, and the Louisiana Chapter of the FBI National Academy are proud to announce the introduction of the 2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA) to Louisiana. Two of the nation's most notable and iconic institutions will conduct law enforcement and legal training for selected youth from the State of Louisiana.

The FLEYA training program will be a FREE weeklong overnight camp exposing students (15 to 17 years of age) to federal, state and local law enforcement practices. This joint effort promotes law enforcement career paths by giving the selected youths an inside look at the various practices and techniques as taught by subject matter experts and agency instructors. Tulane's Uptown campus will serve as the home base for an academic environment with the premier atmosphere to encourage students to pursue higher education and careers in law enforcement.

FLEYA Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Student is a United States Citizen residing in the state of Louisiana
- 2. Student is currently enrolled in a Louisiana High School



- 3. Student must be 15 to 17 years old at the time of the Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA), which will be held June 1-6, 2025
- 4. This program is only for current high school students (students graduating high school in the spring 2025, are not eligible)
- 5. Student minimum GPA of 2.7
- 6. Student must complete the entire application
- 7. Student understands they must be present each day of the FLEYA program; no absences during FLEYA
- Completed application and essay must be emailed in <u>PDF form</u> to <u>LouisianaFLEYA@fbi.gov</u> by February 28, 2025. (Note: No Google Docs or applications requiring a password to access will be accepted.)

In support of critical student and family outreach, the Federal Student Aid (FSA) office is publishing a set of FAFSA guides for non-English speakers in the 10 most spoken languages in the U.S. outside of English and Spanish, as well as making interpretive services available in these languages. Users may access the guides from the <u>FAFSA Support in Other Languages page</u>. Some guides (in Cantonese, Mandarin, Tagalog, Vietnamese, French, Korean, and Russian) are available now, and remaining guides (in German, Arabic, and French Creole) will be published in the coming months.

To assist counselors, mentors, and others supporting students and families with the FAFSA®, FSA released the <u>2025–2026 Counselor Resource for Completing the FAFSA® Form</u>. This guide highlights challenging sections of the FAFSA®, like inviting a parent contributor or completing the



finances section, with clear, step-by-step instructions. Counselors can use it when working with students or share it with others seeking FAFSA[®] guidance.

USDA 1890 National Scholars Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is accepting applications for the USDA 1890 National Scholars Program, which aims to encourage students at 1890 land-grant universities to pursue career paths in food, agriculture, natural resource sciences, or related academic disciplines. **The application deadline is March 1, 2025.**

Young people around the country are invited to complete and <u>submit their applications online</u> through an e-application. Administered through USDA's Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement (OPPE), the USDA 1890 National Scholars Program is available to eligible high school seniors entering their freshman year of college as well as rising college sophomores and juniors.

"The USDA 1890 National Scholars Program enhances career opportunities for students at 1890 land-grant universities," said USDA Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement Director Lisa Ramirez. "The program has also been an effective tool to help USDA recruit and retain highly qualified students into careers in food, agricultural science, natural resources and related fields."

The USDA 1890 National Scholars Program is a partnership between USDA and the 19 land-grant universities that were established in the Morrill Land Grand Act of 1890. USDA partners with these 1890 universities to provide scholarship recipients with full tuition, fees, books and room and board. Scholarship recipients attend one of the 1890 land-grant universities and pursue degrees in agriculture, food, natural resource sciences, or related academic disciplines. The scholarship also provides work experience at USDA through summer internships. Scholars accepted into the program are eligible for noncompetitive conversion to a permanent appointment with USDA upon successful completion of their degree requirements and program requirements by the end of the agreement period. The program awarded 94 scholarships in the 2024 cohort of 1890 Scholars.

The USDA Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement (OPPE) will host three webinars to present information and answer questions about the <u>1890 National Scholars Program</u>. USDA liaisons will present information about the program, eligibility, fields of study and the selection process. The second portion of the webinar will be Q&A.

Board of Regents Interactive Course Articulation Matrix

Please share with high school administrators, school counselors, and teachers.

The Louisiana Board of Regents' General Education Articulation Matrix is a guide for determining which courses are equivalent between public colleges and universities in Louisiana. The matrix helps students transfer credits between institutions.

How does the matrix work?

- The matrix identifies courses with a four-character rubric and a four-digit number.
- The rubric begins with the letter "C" to indicate that it's a state "Common" number.
- The first digit of the course number indicates the academic level.
- The fourth digit indicates the course's credit value in semester hours.

What can I use the matrix for?

- Students can use the matrix to determine which courses will transfer for credit.
- Students can use the matrix to plan their course selection.
- Institutions can use the matrix to evaluate and transfer Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) credits.

What are the limitations of the matrix?

- Courses may not apply to a specific degree program.
- The matrix is limited to general education courses.

Q & A With COunselor COnnect!

Q: I have a student working towards an associate's degree. The student has already met her graduation requirements for Social Studies, having taken World History, American Government, US History, and DE Psychology (CPSY 2013). However, the student has just completed Psyc 2076 (CPSY 2313) at LSUE. Am I transcripting this course as a DE-weighted course? Or just a DE elective course?

- The "yz" Counselor

A: The course should be transcripted as a DE elective. As a reminder, consulting the <u>TOPS University</u> and <u>TOPS Tech</u> Course Requirement documents can help identify whether a course is on the 4 or 5-point scale.
