2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA)

FBI New Orleans, The Tulane University Police Department, and the Louisiana Chapter of the FBI National Academy are proud to announce the introduction of the 2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA) to Louisiana. Two of the nation's most notable and iconic institutions will conduct law enforcement and legal training for selected youth from the State of Louisiana.

The FLEYA training program will be a FREE weeklong overnight camp exposing students (15 to 17 years of age) to federal, state and local law enforcement practices. This joint effort promotes law enforcement career paths by giving the selected youths an inside look at the various practices and techniques as taught by subject matter experts and agency instructors. Tulane's Uptown campus will serve as the home base for an academic environment with the premier atmosphere to encourage students to pursue higher education and careers in law enforcement.

FLEYA Eligibility Criteria

- United States Citizen residing in the state of Louisiana
- Currently enrolled in a Louisiana High School
- 15 to 17 years old at the time of the FLEYA, which will be held June 1-6.
- This program is only for current high school students (students graduating high school in the spring 2025, are not eligible)
- Minimum GPA of 2.7
- Must be present each day of the FLEYA program

A completed <u>application</u> and essay must be submitted in PDF form to <u>LouisianaFLEYA@fbi.gov</u>. No Google docs or applications requiring a password to access will be accepted. This program is only for current high school students.

Middle School News

Encouraging Extracurricular Activities

Please share with school administrators and counselors.

The transition from elementary to middle school can be stressful for parents and students. Middle school students face many challenges including academic and social pressures, identity development, and physical changes.

School counselors can support students by assisting with the development of their social and communication skills. Encouraging students to participate in various extracurricular activities allows them to form new relationships, learn new skills, is a great way to make use of free time, supports positive academic performance and attendance, etc. Research has been done since the 1930s on how participation in extracurricular activities leads to higher levels of academic achievement (Shulruf, Tumen, & Tolley, 2007). Participation in these activities also leads to positive character and social development, as well as community involvement.

In an <u>article</u> written in the Brandon University Journal of Graduate Studies in Education (2013), the author states, "Extracurricular participation supports students' character development by giving them skills required for personal success, such as leadership skills, time-management skills, and the ability to accept constructive criticism." Students participating in these activities are learning skills that will benefit them not only during their academic year, but in all aspects of their lives in the future.

Counselor Rubric and Evaluation Process

Counselor SLTs

Please share with CTE supervisors, principals, school counselors, and secondary supervisors.

As we near the end of the first semester, the Beginning-of-Year (BOY) Conferences should be complete. During this BOY conference, counselors and leaders work together to set goals based on the current student/school data. Student Learning Targets (SLTs) may also be developed in this conference and then entered into LES.

Leaders should now be collecting evidence of progress toward goals to be used in scoring the rubric during Middle-of-Year (MOY) Conferences. The MOY is worth 15% of the overall evaluation score (30% of the qualitative portion). Agendas for groups or meetings held and conversations with counselors, teachers, and students can serve as qualitative data/artifacts. Current and relevant student data (discipline, passage rates, attendance, etc.) are examples of quantitative data. Counselors should use evidence to complete the self-assessment for the MOY. Self-assessments are averaged and are worth 5% of the overall evaluation score.

Work-Based Learning/Internship Teacher Coordinator Training

Application to Employ Minors

Share with CTE supervisors, principals, school counselors, and secondary supervisors.

Students between 14 and 17 years old need to complete the <u>Application to Employ Minors Form</u> which is required for obtaining an employment certificate. Be aware that there are certain hourly restrictions for minors, so it's important to discuss these with the issuing officer in your school system. Students participating in an internship require a CTE Minor Employment Form which uses the same application and is issued by the Certifying Officer. The Certifying Officer must be either the school's work-based learning teacher or its Career and Technical Education (CTE) supervisor.
