Happy New Year, Believe and Prepare Community,

As we welcome the new year, the Believe and Prepare community continues its focus on high-quality preparation as the foundation for strong instruction. Effective lesson preparation is central to strong instruction. Research shows that clearly defined lesson objectives aligned to unit goals improve student achievement by creating a coherent learning trajectory and clarifying the purpose of learning for students (Marzano, 2007). Effective planning requires instructional decisions grounded in student needs and a clear understanding of unit design.

These tools strengthen coherence from unit goals to daily instruction by helping teams consider how skills build over time and how assessments inform planning. Quality preparation begins with unit end goals, identifies essential skills and knowledge, sequences instruction intentionally, and uses collaboration to anticipate student needs and misconceptions, resulting in instruction that is both intentional and responsive.

Teacher preparation providers play a critical role in developing these instructional habits before educators enter the classroom. To align preparation experiences with statewide priorities, providers are encouraged to integrate LDOE unit and lesson preparation tools into coursework and clinical experiences; support candidates in aligning lessons to unit goals, standards, and student outcomes; and model collaborative planning practices that emphasize sequencing, high-quality curriculum use, and anticipation of misconceptions.

By embedding research-aligned planning practices into preparation programs, providers help ensure new educators enter classrooms ready to deliver coherent, high-quality instruction for all learners.

EDUCATOR DEVELOPMENT

Geaux Teach Scholarship Program

[Act 463](#) of the 2022 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature established the [Geaux Teach Program](#), which provides scholarships to students enrolled in teacher preparation programs at the state's postsecondary institutions approved by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE). Funding is also available to students attending alternative teacher preparation programs approved by BESE.

Students may receive up to \$5,000 annually to cover tuition, fees, textbooks, and other instructional materials required for enrollment. Billing dates for the fall semester/term are **November 1**; for the spring semester/term, **May 1**; and for the summer semester/term, **July 1**, when applicable.

High-Need School and High-Need Certification Lists

The 2026-2030 [high-need school](#) and high-need certification lists are now available.

Per [Bulletin 996](#), these lists are updated every four years, with high-need certification areas defined as those with the highest percentage of classes taught by out-of-field or uncertified teachers across the state. The high-need certification areas for 2026-2030 are as follows:

- Mathematics (4-8, 6-12);
- Science (4-8, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Environmental Science, General Science, Physics);
- Social Studies (4-8, 6-12);
- World Language (Chinese K-12, 6-12, French K-12, 6-12, German K-12, 6-2, Italian K-12, 6-12, Latin K-12, 6-12, Spanish K-12, 6-12).

These lists will be used for the Teacher Preparation Quality Rating System Performance Profile Scores beginning with the 2026-2027 residency cohorts.

Annual Teacher Exit Survey Released

The 2024-2025 Teacher Exit Survey was released at the December BESE meeting. Teacher preparation providers can use this information to reinforce positive messaging, validate alignment with district needs, focus retention efforts where they matter most, and make data-informed decisions that strengthen both preparation quality and workforce stability across Louisiana.

This past year saw the following improvements:

- Fewer teachers are citing “accepting a position outside of the field of education” as their primary reason for exiting.
- Fewer teachers cited “accepted a teaching or leadership position outside of Louisiana” as their primary reason for exiting.
- Fewer teachers cited “Resigned - dissatisfaction with school or district policies” as their stated reason for exiting.
- The number of candidates who completed a Louisiana teacher preparation program has increased for the second consecutive year.
- Over the last three years, about 32% of exits have been due to personal circumstances and 2% due to dissatisfaction or anticipated termination, showing no significant increase in negative sentiment among teachers.
