

LDOE Summer Internships Release

Summer Internship Program

Internships are work-based activities in which students work with an employer for a specified period of time to learn about a particular occupation or industry. The LDOE will employ high school students as summer interns to work in specific departmental offices. These interns will be employed as student workers. The workplace activities involved with an internship could include special projects, a sample of tasks from different jobs, or tasks from a single occupation.

In accordance with law, parental permission must be obtained for a student under 18 to apply for an internship as personal identifiable information (PII) will be shared along with media release items. An application for employment for a child under 18 cannot be submitted without this release form.

PII Release

By signing this application, I consent to sharing my child's personally identifiable information contained within this application to the Louisiana Department of Education for the purpose of employment as part of LDOE's High School Summer Internship program. By signing this application, I consent to the publication in news and social media of my child's name and his/her school name, grade level, photos, and description of work done for the LDOE.
