#### Seals of Biliteracy

Since the approval of RS 17:273.4 in 2024, Louisiana students may earn the State Seal of Biliteracy by demonstrating literacy in English and another language. In addition to the Diploma and Seal order form, school systems should submit the Seals of Biliteracy Request Document.

High schools with at least 5% of their graduating class earning the State Seal of Biliteracy will be celebrated at the June BESE meeting.

# Comprehensive Criminal Background Check (CBC) Requirement for Certification

Please share with educators, human resources directors, school leaders, system leaders, teacher candidates, and teacher preparation providers.

Under Louisiana law (R.S. 17:8.9), a comprehensive criminal background check (CBC) is required for teacher certification. This requirement goes beyond the CBC conducted for employment purposes. A fingerprint-based CBC, processed through the Louisiana State Police Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information, is mandatory for issuing, renewing, advancing, or modifying a certificate.

Effective January 1, the LDOE will utilize the updated <u>Professional Conduct Form</u>, included with all certification applications, to determine if a cleared CBC dated within the past five years is on file. If no valid CBC is found, applicants will be instructed to schedule fingerprinting at an <u>IdentoGO</u> location.

Once the applicant's CBC is cleared, a "Clear Credential" will be added to their certification record, allowing all certification requests to be processed.

# **LDOE Removes \$25 Credential Clearance Processing Fee for Certification**

Please share with educators, HR directors, system leaders, teacher preparation providers, and teacher candidates.

The LDOE previously communicated that there would be a \$25 processing and handling fee for the Credential Clearance (CC) application, applicable to certification applicants without a criminal background check (CBC) on file and run in the past five years.

This fee has been removed to implement this new process. Applicants will not be required to pay a fee to the LDOE, and the applicant will not be required to complete an application separate from the certification application requesting issuance, renewal, advancement, or modification. All other certification fees remain the same as outlined on the <a href="Certification Fee chart">Certification Fee chart</a>. The previously communicated fees associated with the criminal background check for the vendor, state police, etc. also remain the same.
