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Message from the Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

The results of the K-3 beginning-of-year literacy screener demonstrate impressive year-over-year growth. Student cohort performance improved by over nine percentage points, with a notable 20.4-point gain by the 2023 kindergarten class as they advanced to first grade in 2024. This progress reflects the dedication of our educators and the success of our phonics-based literacy instruction approach.

Now in its second year, Louisiana's K-3 universal literacy screener provides a critical, standardized measure of reading proficiency during these formative years. Administered three times annually — at the beginning, middle, and end of the year — the screener helps identify students at risk for reading challenges through a variety of assessments.

While state-level data from the middle-of-year screener is not yet available, schools have completed these assessments. It's vital for school leaders and teachers to use the results to deliver targeted interventions, particularly for third-grade students who may be at risk of retention.

Comprehensive Criminal Background Check (CBC) Requirement for Certification

Please share with educators, HR directors, system leaders, school leaders, teacher candidates, and teacher preparation providers.

In accordance with Louisiana law (R.S. 17:8.9), a comprehensive criminal background check (CBC) is required for teacher certification. This requirement goes beyond the CBC conducted for employment purposes. A fingerprint-based CBC, processed through the Louisiana State Police Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information, is mandatory for issuing, renewing, advancing, or modifying a certificate.

Effective January 1, certification applicants will utilize the <u>updated Professional Conduct form</u>, included with all certification applications, to authorize the LDOE to receive a CBC on the educator if one is not already on file and less than five years old. At the time of applying for certification, if no valid CBC is found, applicants will be instructed to <u>schedule fingerprinting at an IdentoGO location</u>. If the applicant already knows that the LDOE does not have a CBC on file, the applicant may schedule fingerprinting with IdentoGO using the <u>Educator Fingerprinting Packet</u>.

Once the applicant's CBC is received, reviewed, and is clear of disqualifying convictions, <u>a "Clear Credential" will be</u> <u>added to their certification record</u>, allowing all certification requests to be processed.

The LDOE previously communicated there would be a \$25 processing and handling fee for the Credential Clearance (CC) application, applicable to certification applicants without a CBC on file and run in the past five years. This fee has been removed during the implementation of this new process. Applicants will not be required to pay a fee to the LDOE and the applicant will not be required to complete an application separate from the certification application

requesting issuance, renewal, advancement, or modification. All other certification fees remain the same as outlined on the <u>Certification Fee chart</u>. The previously communicated fees associated with fingerprinting for the CBC paid directly to IdentoGO stay the same.

2023-2024 Evaluation Close-Out in CIS

All 2023-2024 evaluation data for teachers, counselors, and other instructional staff should be <u>finalized</u> in <u>CIS</u> at this time. The deadline to <u>enter</u> or edit leader evaluations is **January 31**. Data cannot be entered or edited in CIS following this date.

As a reminder, all 2024-2025 evaluation data should be entered directly into LES for all schools, regardless of the chosen evaluation type; there will be no transfer of scores or spreadsheet uploads in the new system.

ACT Match/No Match File

The ACT Match/No Match file is now available on the data manager ftp with file name (TBA). These lists should be used to determine the grade 12 students who will need to participate in the spring state administration of ACT. As a reminder, all students in grade 12, regardless of diploma pathway, must take the ACT in 2024-2025 as required by the current accountability policy. The only exception is for students who participated in high school level LEAP Connect in 2024-2025 or a prior year. Please do not submit requests to update the lists at this time. The lists will be updated again in March prior to ACT spring administration.

School Choice

Charter Schools Local Authorizer Reporting Deadline Please share with school and system leaders.

Local school boards who have received an application for a locally authorized charter during the 2024-2025 Annual RFA Cycle are required to consider all applicants by **January 17**.

Prior to approving a charter for a Type 1 or Type 3 school, school systems are required to hold a public meeting for the purpose of considering the proposal and receiving public input.

The deadline to notify the LDOE of decisions regarding the approval or denial of received applications is **January 31** through the <u>Jotform</u> process.
