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# **Message from the State Superintendent**

Dear Colleagues,

Harvard and Stanford released their annual <u>Education Recovery Scorecard</u> today, which measures the pace of academic recovery since the pandemic. Just like on <u>The Nation's Report Card</u>, Louisiana showed significant gains. The Education Recovery Scorecard ranks Louisiana first in the nation for reading and second for math. Louisiana is the only state where the average student has completed their recovery.

You can read their full Louisiana release online, but here are some other items of note for our state.

- Louisiana ranked first among the states in terms of recovery in reading and 2nd in math between 2019 and 2024.
- Between 2019 and 2024, students in Louisiana earned gains in reading and math at a time when many states continued to fall further behind.
- Louisiana is the only state where the average student has completed their recovery.
- An analysis suggests Louisiana's investment of pandemic funding did contribute to the academic recovery, especially when targeted at academic efforts such as summer learning and tutoring.
- Growth in chronic absenteeism is slowing the recovery in many districts in Louisiana.

One of the most common questions I've received over the past two weeks has been how our state has made this academic progress — especially at a time when many others are struggling. While the reasons are many, first among them are Louisiana teachers.

There is a lot to be proud of in this latest report, and our work continues. There are still too many Louisiana students who can't read on grade level, can't do basic math, and who don't attend school on a regular basis.

Thank you for your part in our success. Let's continue to be brave and push forward.

## 2025 LEADS Louisiana Evaluator Training

## Fingerprint Scheduling with IdentoGO for Credentialing

Please share with educators, HR directors, school leaders, system leaders, and teacher preparation providers.

As part of the certification process for obtaining a "<u>Clear Credential</u>," all applicants must complete a criminal background check (CBC) through IdentoGO, following the instructions provided in the <u>Educator Fingerprinting</u> <u>Packet</u>.

When scheduling a fingerprinting appointment, applicants must use the correct service code for our office to receive the CBC. The service code to be used when scheduling on the <u>IdentoGO website</u> for credentialing purposes is **27N5HQ**. This ensures the CBC is processed specifically for LDOE's Certification & Background Credentialing office. It is encouraged to disclose the applicant's social security number when scheduling and fingerprinting so that the CBC can quickly be associated with any existing certification records.

A CBC is required only once for certification. The LDOE continuously receives state "rap backs" (updated criminal history notifications), eliminating the need for repeated fingerprinting in most cases when maintaining certification.

# <u>Level Up: School Support Institutes at Teacher Leader Summit 2025</u> Please share with school and school leaders.

### 2024-2025 Annual RFA Application Cycle Letters of Intent

Applicants must meet the eligibility requirements listed in <u>LA Bulletin 126. §503</u>, and submit an eligibility determination form by March 10. Eligibility determination forms will only be reviewed if a Letter of Intent was received by the due date. Any eligibility form submitted without adherence to the Letter of Intent due date requirement will not be reviewed.
