The LDOE will audit the self-assessment results to ensure they accurately represent best practices in the implementation of the April Dunn Act.

- Earned a National Center Construction Education and Research credential
- Plan to enroll at an LCTCS campus:
  - On a construction pathway
  - o In an Associated Builders and Contractors Training Program

#### **Proficiency Exam Reporting Per Policy**

Please share with CTE instructors, CTE supervisors, and high school counselors.

Credit by proficiency is awarding a student credit in a course in which he or she has never been enrolled but has taken an exam or completed a portfolio that exemplifies proficiency. The LDOE may accept the exam, recommend that the exam should not be used to award credit, and/or make recommendations for changes. The LDOE may deny an exam be used to award credit if it does not meet standards. The revised Proficiency by Exam Submission Form will be used to collect exam submissions through March. The LDOE will process these requests in April and May and report acceptance or denial in June.

## **Louisiana Legislative Youth Advisory Council Now Accepting Applications**

The Louisiana Legislative Youth Advisory Council (LYAC) is accepting applications for membership from high school students interested in representing the voices of young people around the state. LYAC is an annually appointed body composed entirely of students who tackle issues affecting the youth of Louisiana. The purpose of LYAC is to facilitate communication between youth and the legislature and to give students a unique opportunity to be involved in the workings of state government. The Council studies and addresses various issues of importance to young people, such as education, mental health, civic engagement, the environment, and school safety.

Members of LYAC are selected from a large pool of applicants who display a strong interest in civic involvement. The 31 members include three students representing each of the six congressional districts, and the remaining serve at large. Applicants must be between the ages of fourteen and nineteen and enrolled in a public or private high school, charter school, home school, or GED skills program during the 2025-2026 school year.

The new LYAC will meet for the first time in July, with a two-day seminar at the state capitol. It will then meet every other month in person on a Saturday in Baton Rouge beginning in September. In the months in between, the LYAC will meet on Zoom.

The application deadline is March 28. Visit the <u>Louisiana Commission on Civic Education</u> for more information. All applicants must submit two letters of recommendation in addition to the six short answer questions on the application form.
