We are seeking districts to participate in the <u>Middle to High School (M2HS) initiative</u>. This initiative will expand access by offering a training and support series for the Special Education Director and a cohort of teachers from selected districts that foster informed, effective transitions into high school. Significant Disproportionality

Please share with special education leaders and system leaders.

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires states to examine the likelihood that students with disabilities from one race/ethnicity will be subject to over-identification, restrictive placement, or exclusionary discipline actions relative to students with disabilities from all other races/ethnicities in each school system. Significant Disproportionality Notification Letters will be provided to **identified** school systems the week of March

31. Notification letters will be placed in the Diverse Learner folder (purged after 30 days) on the data management FTP. Any school system identified as having significant disproportionality is required to set aside 15% of its IDEA budget to address comprehensive coordinated early intervening services (CCEIS) in Super App for the 2025-2026 school year.

<u>Spring 2025 New Homeless Liaison and Parent and Family Engagement Federal Compliance</u> Conference

The LDOE will host the Annual <u>Spring 2025 Conference for New Homeless Liaisons and all Parent and Family Engagement Coordinators</u> on April 11 at the Claiborne Building at 1201 North Third Street in Baton Rouge.

The conference will include two sessions:

- PAFE Coordinators will attend a half-day session from 9 a.m. 12 p.m. The session will review the new non-regulatory guidance and federal mandates to align daily practices with national standards and compliance requirements.
- New Homeless Liaisons will attend the McKinney Vento 101 session from 1 p.m. 4 p.m. The session will provide an in-depth look into the McKinney Vento Law and the roles and responsibilities in serving individuals experiencing homelessness.

All PAFE Coordinators and New Homeless Liaisons are encouraged to attend. Attendees must register in advance.

New Guidance Available Regarding Applied Behavior Analysis Services in Schools Please share with school counselors, school administrators, and school system-level administrators.

Act 745 of the 2024 Regular Legislative Session amended Louisiana Revised Statute 17:173 regarding applied behavior analysis (ABA) services in schools. The policy approved by BESE in August 2024 is now final in <u>Bulletin 135 - Health and Safety</u>. Additional guidance for school and system leaders has been prepared to assist in effective implementation of the statutory and policy provisions.

Career and College Readiness

High School Summer Internships

The LDOE will hire up to 5 high school students for internships in various offices within the agency. Applications will be accepted from April 1 to April 25. These summer internships will be employed for 160 hours from June 16 to July 14 with a pay rate of \$10 per hour. Interns will be assigned tasks specific to the office in which they are employed. Interviews of qualified applicants will be held in the afternoons of May 5-16.

Once students have been selected, on May 27, school systems will be contacted to determine if the school system can offer the classroom experience to transcribe the experience.
