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# **Message from the State Superintendent**

Dear Colleagues,

It's fitting that as the Louisiana Legislature begins its 2025 Regular Session, our state also took another step towards elevating civics education.

Last week, BESE approved a new diploma endorsement designed to recognize students who demonstrate excellence in civics. Starting with the 2025–2026 school year, high schoolers who score Mastery or above on the LEAP civics assessment will earn the Freedom Framework Diploma Endorsement — complete with a red, white, and blue honor cord and a diploma seal.

This new policy was adopted following testimony from four Louisiana high school students, who spoke powerfully about the importance of civics education and the impact it has had on their lives.

This endorsement aligns with our Freedom Framework social studies standards and reinforces our belief that civics education is foundational. I've said before that if a country doesn't understand its own history or the civics that govern it, that's a national security risk. Today, less than a quarter of students graduate proficient in civics. In Louisiana, we are committed to changing that by setting higher expectations and celebrating students who rise to meet them.

Thank you for the work you do every day to support Louisiana's students and strengthen our state.

#### Fingerprint Scheduling with IdentoGO for Credentialing

Please share with educators, human resources (HR) directors, teacher candidates, teacher preparation providers, school leaders, and system leaders.

As part of the certification process for obtaining a <u>"Clear Credential"</u>, all <u>applicants must complete a criminal background check (CBC)</u> through IdentoGO, following the instructions provided in the <u>Educator Fingerprinting Packet</u>.

Tips for successful and efficient fingerprinting:

 Schedule fingerprinting using the correct service code; if being fingerprinted for employment, the applicant should use the employer's service code, but if being fingerprinted for certification, the applicant should use service code 27N5HQ.

- Applicants are encouraged to schedule fingerprinting in Louisiana to reduce their fingerprinting fees. If applicants are not able to schedule fingerprinting with an IdentoGO location, there is a mail-in option. Please email <a href="mailto:EducatorClearance@la.gov">EducatorClearance@la.gov</a> for details if that is needed.
- Applicants are encouraged to provide their Social Security Number at the time of scheduling and fingerprinting so that the CBC may be associated with any existing certification records quickly.
- Applicants should avoid entering a mailing address that exceeds 30 characters; abbreviate as needed to keep the address below 30 characters.
- Applicants should avoid using apostrophes or special characters in their addresses.
- Typically, CBCs are securely, electronically transmitted to LDOE within just a few hours following fingerprinting, but if an applicant does not see the "Clear Credential" notation on their certification record in three weeks, the applicant should email <a href="mailto:EducatorClearance@la.gov">EducatorClearance@la.gov</a>.

A CBC is required only once for certification. The LDOE continuously receives state "rap backs" (updated criminal history notifications), eliminating the need for repeated fingerprinting in most cases when maintaining certification.

Please ensure that all applicants and relevant personnel are aware of these requirements to prevent delays in the CBC and certification process. For additional guidance, refer to the <a href="Educator Fingerprinting Packet">Educator Fingerprinting Packet</a>

In addition, two <u>full-length lesson sets</u> are also now available. These sets include pre-conference, observation, post-conference, and PGP/coaching plan materials. The <u>Video Clip Collection</u>, which highlights classroom instructional best practices aligned to the Instructional Domain indicators of the <u>Louisiana Educator Rubric (LER)</u>, is also available.

These resources offer access to professional learning for system leaders, school leaders, teacher leaders, and teachers to support the advancement of classroom instruction and student learning. Louisiana educators can use these materials in various professional learning settings to deepen the knowledge of the LER, build rater reliability and a common language for the LER, and hone LER observation skills.

#### 2025 LEADS Louisiana Evaluator Training

Additional dates have been added to the <u>2025 LEADS Evaluator Training</u> schedule, and registration is open. All evaluators and designated observers must attend face-to-face training and take a certification assessment before evaluating. To qualify for the assessment, evaluators must attend all full, consecutive days. Evaluators are encouraged to register for earlier dates to allow time to reschedule if conflicts arise. Registrants should cancel registration if they cannot attend to allow those on the waitlist to participate. Evaluators/observers who have attended LER or LLCR Training previously do not need to attend the training again; an email with instructions on recertifying in the Professional Learning Platform/Canopy will be sent to these individuals soon.

This anonymous survey is a key component of the Louisiana Educator Advancement and Development System (LEADS) and provides a valuable opportunity for educators to share feedback on their school principal. It is designed to gather anonymous, confidential input regarding a principal's leadership and overall effectiveness.

Each teacher will be allowed to submit one survey. Please note that once submitted, surveys cannot be edited or resubmitted. LES system contacts will receive an email with additional information. Survey submissions will be accepted through May 30.

## **Jump Start Construction Connect Scholarship**

Please share with administrators, school counselors, and CTE Supervisors.

The <u>Jump Start Construction Connect Scholarship</u> awards \$1,000 scholarships to train the next generation of skilled workers. Up to 40 scholarships will be awarded to high school seniors from across the state.

Students are eligible to apply if they have a National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) credential, will earn a Jump Start Career Diploma, and will enroll full-time in an LCTCS Construction Pathway Program or an ABC training program in the summer or fall immediately following graduation. The application deadline is April 22.
