LDOE Course Code Request Form

Course codes are created once per year in response to field requests by using the <u>Course Code Request Form</u>. Requests are due annually by October 1 for the following academic year. Following review by the Data Governance Work Group, a decision notification for each request will be emailed monthly to the school system's point of contact listed on the request form.

New and updated course codes will be announced in May as part of the System Enhancements Update for the following academic year. Only school system submissions will be considered; vendor submissions are excluded.

Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management Training (BTAM)

Please share with behavioral threat assessment teams, school safety personnel, and school system leaders.

The Governor's Office of Homeland Security & Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP)/Louisiana Center for Safe Schools (LCSS) is implementing a statewide standardized integrated Threat Assessment Tool and Central Reporting Mechanism called <u>Outreach</u>, a FERPA and HIPAA-compliant software platform.

In support of the Louisiana Statewide Threat Assessment Prevention Plan, Outreach will build on the existing Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management (BTAM) Training to provide infrastructure for multi-agency coordination and communication, incorporating the Trauma-Informed Protocol for Threat Assessment. GOHSEP/LCSS is hosting statewide focus groups to implement the statewide deployment and Outreach rollout.

Excellence in Authorizing Community of Practice

Registration is now open for the <u>2025-2026 Excellence in Authorizing Consortium for Charter Authorizers</u>. The Excellence in Authorizing Consortium was developed to build the individual and collective capacities of school

systems in Louisiana to authorize charters using best practices. LEA Charter Authorizers will attend two full-day, in-person trainings and three virtual courses designed to strengthen the expertise of local authorizers and provide ongoing development in the best practices of charter school authorization. The Excellence in Authorizing Consortium will begin May 28 and end September 24.

Districts that participate in the Excellence in Authorizing Consortium and contribute to the Community of Practice are eligible for a <u>CSP Microgrant</u>, intended to support the pursuit of quality authorizing.
