inquiryHub (iHub) Biology Transition From High-Quality Pilot

In the 2025-2026 school year, inquiryHub Biology will no longer be designated as a high-quality pilot. This change follows the second phase of materials developed by the iHub team with the completion of the OpenSciEd Biology, Chemistry, and Physics materials.

While the foundational inquiryHub materials will remain on the iHub website until 2027, the iHub team will only offer professional learning for the OpenSciEd high school materials.

Systems and schools planning to adopt a new high-quality option for high school Biology may consider <u>OpenSciEd High School Biology</u> or BSCS Biology. Both of these curricula are supported by professional learning. More information on these materials can be found on the <u>K-12 Science Planning web page</u>.

LEADS Principal Survey

The Principal Survey is now open in the Louisiana Evaluation System (LES). Each educator will be allowed to submit one survey that provides feedback on the principal of their school. Please note that once submitted, surveys cannot be edited or resubmitted. LES system contacts have received an email with information, including the Principal Survey Guide for Educators.

Although the survey will remain open through May 30, systems should set an internal deadline before this date to ensure participation from educators.

Fingerprint Scheduling with IdentoGO for Credentialing

Please share with educators, human resources directors, school leaders, system leaders, teacher candidates, and teacher preparation providers.

As part of the certification process for obtaining a <u>"Clear Credential"</u>, all applicants must complete a <u>criminal background check (CBC)</u> through IdentoGO, following the instructions provided in the <u>Educator Fingerprinting Packet</u>.

Tips for successful and efficient fingerprinting:

- Use the correct service code. If being fingerprinted for employment, the applicant should use the employer's service code, but if being fingerprinted for certification, the applicant should use service code 27N5HQ.
- Schedule fingerprinting in Louisiana to reduce fingerprinting fees. If applicants cannot schedule fingerprinting with an IdentoGO location, use the mail-in option.
- Provide Social Security Number at the time of scheduling and fingerprinting so that the CBC may be associated with any existing certification records quickly.
- Abbreviate the mailing address as needed to keep below 30 characters.
- Avoid using apostrophes or special characters in addresses.

Typically, CBCs are securely, electronically transmitted to LDOE within just a few hours following fingerprinting, but if an applicant does not see the "Clear Credential" notation on their certification record in three weeks, the applicant should email EducatorClearance@la.gov.

A CBC is required only once for certification. The LDOE continuously receives state "rap backs" (updated criminal history notifications), eliminating the need for repeated fingerprinting in most cases when maintaining certification.

Please ensure that all applicants and relevant personnel are aware of these requirements to prevent delays in the CBC and certification process. For additional guidance, refer to the Educator Fingerprinting Packet.

Education Excellence Fund (EEF) 6/30 Periodic Expense Report (PER) Submissions

Please share with business managers, EEF coordinators, school leaders, and superintendents.

The eGMS system is open to begin submitting EEF 6/30 PERs. Schools and agencies that received a payment from the 2024-2025 Education Excellence Fund (EEF) this year are advised of the following important dates:

- May 30: Final date for EEF Amendments
- June 30: Deadline for EEF recipients to obligate EEF funds
- July 15: Deadline for EEF recipients to submit Final 6/30 PERs

The Final PERs are used to calculate EEF allocations for the following year. If the Final PER is not submitted by July 15, EEF recipients may experience delays accessing their EEF funds for 2025-2026.

When finalizing the PER, navigate to the first tab, "Expenditure Obligation Summary," and locate the "Final Expenditure" checkbox at the bottom. Ensure this box is checked. Failing to do so will prevent the PER from being reported as final, necessitating corrections and resubmission.

Consolidated Monitoring Schedule for 2024-2025 SY (Third Quarter Only)

Excellence in Authorizing Community of Practice

Registration is now open for the 2025-2026 Community of Practice for Charter Authorizers. The Excellence in Authorizing Consortium was developed to build the individual and collective capacities of school systems in Louisiana to authorize charters using best practices. LEA Charter Authorizers will attend two full-day, in-person trainings and three virtual courses designed to strengthen the expertise of local authorizers and provide ongoing development in the best practices of charter school authorization. The Excellence in Authorizing Consortium will begin May 28 and end September 24.

Districts that participate in the Excellence in Authorizing Consortium and contribute to the Community of Practice are eligible for a CSP Microgrant, intended to support the pursuit of quality authorizing.
