It offers clear definitions, actionable steps, and a tiered system of support designed to help schools remove barriers to attendance and connect every student with the resources they need to succeed. In tandem with the release of the strategy, LDOE has also unveiled a new <u>student attendance landing page</u> housed under School System Resources. This online hub gives school and system leaders fast access to guidance documents, data tools, customizable templates, and legal references—all in one place.

This initiative is part of the state's ongoing commitment to accelerating learning and ensuring that every child has the opportunity to be present, prepared, and on a path to success.

# <u>Louisiana Elementary and Secondary Education Act Fiscal Flexibility Waiver Request</u> Please share with business managers, federal program directors, financial officials, and superintendents.

The LDOE has requested that the U.S. Department of Education (ED) approve its tidings waiver to receive the opportunity to access additional flexibilities for certain funds received under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA).

In recent communication received from ED, the requested ESEA Waiver has been approved. This waiver includes flexibility for carryover limitation on FY 2024 Title I Part A funds, period of availability of FY2023 funds for Title I Part A, B, C, and D; Title II Part A, Title III Part A, Title IV Part A and B; and Title V Part B Subpart 2. ### Mid-Year 2025-2026 RFA Application Cycle

Please share with school and system leaders.

The mid-year 2025-2026 RFA Application Cycle opened on June 11. The mid-year application process is for any applicant team whose application was denied by a local board during the 2024-2025 RFA cycle, which had not applied for a Type 2 or 4 during the Annual BESE cycle or any Corporate Charter.

#### Mid-Year 2025-2026 New Charter School Request for Applications Timeline:

- June 11: LDOE Application Window Open for Types 2 and 4 Charters
- **June 30**: Letter of Intent Due to the LDOE by 5 p.m.
- **July 7**: Eligibility Determination Forms Due by 5 p.m.
- **July 18**: Full Application for Types 2 and 4 Charter Applicants Due by 5 p.m.

BESE will consider applications for new charter schools from Type 2 and Type 4 applicants at their December 9 meeting.

### FY 25 Fiscal Year End Deadlines

To ensure all FY 2024–2025 grant funding is properly utilized, the LDOE has established the following claim deadlines. Failure to meet these deadlines risks funding availability for school systems and schools. Please note that the LDOE cannot guarantee the payment of late reimbursements or claims.

**Upcoming Claim Deadlines:** 

- June 19: 8(g) claims due in eGMS
- July 7: Carl Perkins claims for June expenses due in eGMS
- **July 15**: Claims for all other state and federal awards (excluding 8(g) and Carl Perkins) with an end date of June 30 due in eGMS

#### **Lead School Business Administrator Certification Requirements**

Please share with business managers and school business officials.

Lead School Business Administrator Certification requirements contained in Bulletin 1929, Louisiana Accounting and Uniform Governmental Handbook, were amended by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to incorporate the charter school business administrator credential requirements adopted in Bulletin 126, Charter Schools, and to revise the local school district and charter school business administrator credential, reducing the number of years from seven to four for earning the mandatory certification while employed as the lead school business administrator. Effective July 1, all school business officials within all school systems must become certified as an administrator within four years of being employed as the lead school business administrator.
