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# Message from the Deputy Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

It was a pleasure to connect with so many of you during Teacher Leader Summit. In my opening session remarks, I spoke about the power of being intentional and shared examples of how educators choosing the most impactful work at the most impactful time is writing a new story for Louisiana education.

Intentionality shows up in many ways, including in how we communicate. One way we want to support you is by sharing timely resources and reminders to keep top of mind each month.

While school may be out for the summer, we know you are in full planning mode for the new school year. Here are some things to prioritize in July:

- **Set clear priorities** that are specific to this next school year and align, don't repeat, your overall system priorities: Where will the focus be to make maximum impact on student learning?
- Communicate expectations around these priorities with school leaders during your summer leader professional learning. Clear is kind!
- Stay laser-focused on filling every vacancy. Utilize innovative staffing and new policies and practices to ensure as many vacancies as possible are filled. Our <a href="Pathways to Teaching">Pathways to Teaching</a> resource outlines Louisiana certification requirements.
- Welcome new teachers through thoughtful onboarding. New teachers need professional learning and
  guidance in an intentional sequence in order to not be overwhelmed or frustrated. You can utilize some of our
  New Teacher Experience resources or encourage new teachers to attend our <a href="summer kick-off">summer kick-off</a> on July 24 in
  Baton Rouge.

To reduce the amount of time needed for data certification in summer 2025:

- All credentials for graduates must be posted to the transcript in STS by June 30. This includes credentials, dual enrollment courses, associate degrees, AP, and work-based learning coursework.
- All dropout corrections for high school students, for which there is documentation, must be completed in EdLink 360 by July 11.
- Summer graduates should have certified transcripts, with graduation dates no later than August 31, as soon as all diploma requirements are met.
