2024-2025 Seclusion and Restraint Verification Deadline

To be included in the final Seclusion and Restraint report, all updates in SER and the submission of new or revised policies were due by July 1. To ensure data accuracy, the LDOE now requires school systems to submit a signed assurance verifying that their data has been reviewed and is complete and accurate.

An updated Seclusion and Restraint Verification Report for signatures is available for each school system in the Data Management FTP. A signed verification report will serve as the school system's assurance that the data was reviewed and is accurate. Principal Survey Results

Results are only available for principals who received at least 10 completed surveys; principals who do not meet this threshold will not receive a survey score.

The New Teacher Experience: Summer Kick-Off Registration is OPEN

Clear Credentials and Fingerprinting Resources

Please share with educators, human resources staff, teacher candidates, teacher preparation providers, school leaders, and system leaders.

Educators seeking certification issuance, modification, or verification require a criminal background check (CBC) for certification, separate from any CBC run for employment. The CBC is transmitted to LDOE's Certification and

Educator Background Credentialing office after an individual schedules and is fingerprinted (refer to the Educator Fingerprinting Packet for scheduling details). It is a one-time requirement resulting in the issuance of a "Clear Credential," which remains valid for life as long as the certificate holder is not sanctioned for future disqualifying convictions. This is not a certificate; rather, it is an indicator that a person has undergone the CBC for certification and no disqualifying convictions were found. The Educator Background Credentialing office has granted 11,314 "Clear Credentials" since the implementation of <u>LA R.S. 17:8.9</u>, effective January 1.

After fingerprinting under service code **27N5HQ**, applicants may check the <u>status of fingerprinting with IdentoGO online</u>. If the "Clear Credential" does not appear on <u>www.teachlouisiana.net</u> in three weeks or less, email <u>EducatorClearance@la.gov</u> for assistance in providing a copy of the fingerprinting receipt.

Act 409, Senate Bill 41 Key Focus Areas for K-12 School Systems

Signed into law as <u>Act 409</u>, <u>Senate Bill 41</u> strengthens child welfare and safety standards in education. While much of the legislation applies to early learning centers, several key changes impact all school systems, including:

Louisiana Educator Certification (LEC) - New Application Portal Implementation

Please share with educators, human resources staff, school leaders, system leaders, teacher candidates, and teacher preparation providers.

Testing is complete for the new application submission system, which is expected to launch in the Louisiana Educator Portal on July 28. An official launch date and training sessions for Human Resources and Preparation Providers will be announced shortly on <u>TeachLouisiana.net</u> and <u>TeachLALive!</u>.

The requirements for access are detailed below:

- Educators will only need a <u>MyLA</u> account. All educators already accessing LEP for evaluation will automatically have access to LEC when launched.
- HR personnel already accessing LEP for evaluation will only need to request permissions in EdLink Security for the application features. More information on how to request permissions will be provided when LEC is launched.
- HR personnel who do not currently use LEP for evaluation and teacher preparation providers will need:
 - An eScholar Staff ID
 - A MyLA account
 - Request permissions in EdLink Security

HR personnel and teacher preparation providers who do not already have an eScholar Staff ID and/or a MyLA account can create both before LEC is launched. Click the MyLA link and follow the prompts to create an account.

Governmental, Administrative, Public Affairs, and Operations

Annual Reporting for Act 420

Please share with human resources staff and system leaders.

R.S. 17:4035.1 requires an annual report to the legislature regarding student transfers within and between public school districts. All districts not under a desegregation order must have a school choice policy in place with a transfer request period spanning at least four weeks in March. Information regarding the number and disposition of intradistrict (within the school district) requests and interdistrict (transfer to a school outside of the geographical school district boundaries) requests must be reported to the LDOE no later than August 15, using this Jotform link.

2025-2026 Nonpublic Annual Enrollment Reporting Opens

All nonpublic schools approved by BESE are required to submit their 2025–2026 annual enrollment data. The submission window is August 1 through October 15.

Before completing the school NPS Annual Enrollment Report, the designated school administrator responsible for entering accurate data must create an EdLink account and request the "NPS School Manager" role. USDA Required School Lunch
