# The New Teacher Experience Professional Learning Modules: Registration is now OPEN Please share with school leaders, school system leaders, and new teachers.

The LDOE, in partnership with A+PEL, has developed monthly <u>professional learning modules</u> on topics that are critical for new teacher success. These modules include online asynchronous content followed by an in-person learning lab where participants practice and apply these concepts.

This year, complimentary seating will be offered for the first 200 registrants. Half of the seats for the northern location (Monroe) and half for the southern location (Baton Rouge) will be reserved as complimentary seating. Once those seats are exhausted, teachers may still attend, but the cost to complete the series of modules will be \$1,272 per teacher.

Teachers must receive approval to attend from their school leader. <u>Registration</u> is now open. Once teachers complete the registration, participants will receive details on selected training locations and an invitation to access the online asynchronous modules.

## LES for 2025-2026

LES is a data-driven system that requires staff data to identify evaluation requirements for each staff member and ensure accurate role assignments. Staff extract uploads can begin on August 11. This includes updated position codes, locations, and assignments. Staff extract data must be uploaded to Edlink 360 before 2025-2026 evaluations can begin.

## **LES Evaluation Closeout**

Systems should continue to finalize 2024-2025 educator evaluations in the Louisiana Evaluation System (LES) portal. Evaluations can be finalized (including VAM teachers) if all components of the evaluation are complete and data is available to report for SLTs. VAM scores will be added on the backend when available.

Evaluations should be marked incomplete for any employee who should have been evaluated by LEADS (or Legacy system) but did not receive a 2024-2025 evaluation. Refer to <u>Bulletin 130</u> for the conditions that allow an evaluation to be marked incomplete.

#### Numeracy

# **Louisiana Achievement in Numeracy Act (LANE)**

Please share with school leaders, system leaders, and teachers.

Act 260 of 2023 requires all mathematics teachers in grades 4–8 to complete an LDOE-approved professional learning course focused on numeracy instruction by August 1.. System and school leaders must request a completed certificate from any employee being hired to teach mathematics in grades 4–8, following the completion date specified in the legislation.

Act 353 of 2025 (LANE) requires all K–3 mathematics teachers to complete an approved foundational numeracy course by August 2027. Together, these laws ensure that all K–8 mathematics teachers participate in high-quality, LDOE-identified professional learning aligned with effective numeracy practices. While a course for high school mathematics teachers is available, it is currently optional. System contacts for K-8 mathematics have been identified and provided with the system-specific course codes. All courses will remain open through the 2025-2026 academic year to ensure consistency. #### **FY24 Title IV Flexibility Waiver Request**

The LDOE is requesting a waiver on behalf of the State educational agency (SEA) and its subgrantees (i.e., local educational agencies (LEAs), pursuant to section 8401(b) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), of one or more of the requirements of Title IV, Part A of the ESEA. This waiver, in alignment with the vision of the current administration, provides states more flexibility regarding supporting school systems in implementing effective and efficient federal programs.

Federal program directors, business managers, financial officials, and relevant personnel of public school systems should review this <u>waiver request</u> and submit questions or comments by July 31.

# Assessments, Accountability, and Analytics

#### K-3 Screening

Please share with school leaders and testing coordinators.

Test coordinator manuals (TCM) and test administrator manuals (TAM) for K-3 literacy screening are now posted to the Louisiana mCLASS page.

- All test administrators (TAs) must have been trained before administration in both administration and test security. While TAs do not have to repeat the Amplify training each year, all TAs must be trained in test security annually.
- Although the beginning-of-year screening instrument is not secure, the screening must be provided in a secure environment, and teachers may not provide cues, clues, or hints at any time.

• The actual screening instrument may not be used to drill students before, during, or after administration.

Testing coordinators will be notified when the TCM and TAM for the numeracy screening are posted.
