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Message from the Deputy Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

Across Louisiana, schools are welcoming back educators and students for a new year of learning. I have enjoyed seeing how so many of you are rolling out the red carpet for teachers, students, and families.

As the new school year begins, I encourage you to be intentional in your leadership and planning. Here are a few key actions to keep top of mind for August:

- Develop and refine long-range plans for instructional leadership. Set a clear vision for your system-level instructional leadership team (ILT) and principal meetings this fall. Consider how your ILT can align the voices of its members and support the expectations communicated for this school year. Use principal meetings to establish an arc of learning that builds leadership in your schools' identified areas of need.
- Prioritize school visits, classroom observations, and aligned support. Now is the time to build
 purposeful calendars for walkthroughs, coaching, and feedback. System and school leaders should
 work together to ensure consistent support for every level of the instructional team, including school
 leaders, instructional coaches, and teachers. Consider how you will reinforce and support
 implementation of the expectations you have shared.
- Continue to welcome new teachers through thoughtful onboarding. Early support has a lasting impact. Be intentional in how you welcome new educators and work to avoid overwhelming them.
 Professional learning, mentorship, and clear guidance create a strong foundation. Our New Teacher Experience resources can support this work.
- Support beginning-of-year student screening and data review. Quality data at the start of the year
 empowers educators to make informed decisions. Ensure schools have the support they need to
 administer screeners effectively and use the results to inform instructional strategies and responsive
 leadership.

August sets the tone for the school year. The choices you make now, both in planning and in practice, can shape conditions for strong teaching and impactful learning. Thank you for leading with care, clarity, and purpose, and for keeping students and educators at the heart of your work.

LEADS Training for Teachers

Act 409 Hiring Practices

Please share with human resource directors and systems leaders.

Act 409 (Senate Bill 41) strengthens child welfare and safety standards in education. While much of the legislation applies to early learning centers, several key provisions affect all school systems, particularly through updates to <u>LA R.S. 17:15</u>, which governs hiring and dismissal practices.

When considering an individual for employment, in addition to a criminal background check (CBC)*, the employer is directed to check the DCFS state central registry. Persons with prohibited convictions, those listed in R.S. 15:587.1(C), or whose name is recorded on the DCFS central registry as a person who has a substantiated complaint of child abuse or neglect on or after August 1, 2018, cannot be hired by a local public school board or a nonpublic school system. School systems may access the DCFS registry through the Child Abuse and Neglect Clearance System (CANS). To request access beginning August 1, refer to the CANS K-12 Public School User Access Guide or the CANS K-12 Non-Public School User Access Guide.

Annual Financial Report Submission via EdLinks Portal

Starting with the FY 2024-2025 reporting year, school systems are required to submit the Annual Financial Report (AFR) via the new EdLink AFR portal. The LEADs portal is being decommissioned and will not be available for school systems to utilize for the FY 2024-2025 reporting period.

Each school system will be responsible for attending the training to learn the new EdLink AFR portal. The Office of School System Financial Services, in collaboration with the Office of Technology Services (OTS), will host training demo webinars on the following dates and times:

- August 14 at 10 a.m.
- August 19 at 10 a.m.
- August 28 at 10 a.m.

It is required that each school system designate at least one representative to attend one of the training sessions. Business Managers will receive instructions on how to register for the webinars. Once registered, participants will receive information on how to log in to the training webinar. All school systems must have an attendee registered for a session by August 12.
