Act 409 Hiring Practices

Please share with human resource directors and system leaders.

Signed into law as <u>Act 409</u>, <u>Senate Bill 41</u> strengthens child welfare and safety standards in education. While much of the legislation applies to early learning centers, several key provisions affect all school systems, particularly through updates to <u>LA R.S. 17:15</u>, which governs hiring practices.

When considering an individual for employment, in addition to a criminal background check (CBC), the employer is directed to check the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) state central registry. Persons with prohibited convictions, those listed in R.S. 15:587.1(C), or whose name is recorded on the DCFS central registry as a person who has a substantiated complaint of child abuse or neglect on or after August 1, 2018, cannot be hired by a local public school board or a nonpublic school system. School systems may request a State Central Registry clearance through the Child Abuse and Neglect Clearance System (CANS). To request access, refer to the CANS K-12 Public School User Access Guide or the CANS K-12 Non-Public School User Access Guide.

LDOE and Reagan Institute Launch Statewide Oratory Competition for Students

The LDOE has partnered with the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation & Institute to launch a new oratory competition in honor of America's 250th anniversary and Celebrate Freedom Week. The competition invites K-12 students to explore the meaning of freedom through public speaking and creative expression.

Students will engage with a selected radio address by President Ronald Reagan, with prompts and expectations tailored to each grade band. Finalists will compete in a statewide event, and the middle and high school winners will earn a trip to the national finals at the Reagan Presidential Library in California.

2025-2026 Direct Student Services Application

Please share with business managers, federal program directors, and superintendents.

In response to new federal guidance, the LDOE will begin implementing the Direct Student Services (DSS) provision under Title I, Part A starting in the 2025-2026 school year. This initiative will redirect a portion of federal funding to services that go directly to students, such as tutoring and academic enrichment. For the upcoming year, LDOE will reallocate 1.5% (about \$5.8 million) of Title I funds.

The application will launch in eGMS on September 1, with a deadline of October 1 to submit. For more information, please see the LDOE's 2025-2026 DSS one-pager.

Assessments, Accountability, and Analytics

ACT, DCAI Data Certification

Please share with accountability coordinators and school leaders.

Student-level rosters for data that will be used to calculate ACT and DCAI indices for the 2025 school performance scores will be posted in La Data Review during the week of August 18. Access to the review site is limited to the accountability contact and backup accountability contact.

All accountability contacts will be notified prior to opening by email with user username and password information. The email will include attached resources for completing the review.

The LDOE should be notified as soon as possible of any changes to the accountability contacts using the <u>DTC and Accountability Contact Update Form</u>. This form must be completed and submitted by the superintendent to <u>assessment@la.gov</u>.

This will be the final opportunity to review data for the indices before the release of 2025 school performance scores in late fall.

ACT MOUS

Please share with district test coordinators and school leaders.

The ACT Memorandum of Understanding for 2025-2026 has been posted to <u>Assessment Resources</u>. This document must be completed by all school systems that plan to test students in grades 11 or 12 who will not be paid for by the LDOE. Those who qualify for state payment include students who:

- Take the ACT in grade 11
- Take the ACT in grade 12
 - Do not have a prior year score on file with the LDOE
- Students who take WorkKeys in grade 11
 - Are on the Jump Start diploma pathway
 - Do not have a prior year score on file with the LDOE

The memorandum confirms that school systems will reimburse the LDOE for all other students. Students in grades other than 11 or 12 are not permitted to participate in the spring statewide administration. School systems should contact ACT for information regarding a district contract for grades 9 or 10.
