Message from the State Superintendent

Louisiana Teachers.

School System Relations

Louisiana's academic progress is being noticed across the nation, and it's because of your dedication to students.

Over the next few weeks, I will share some of the steps being taken to support you as you continue driving student outcomes. Today, I want to start with an issue that matters to every teacher: pay.

- One-Time Stipend: The Louisiana legislature approved stipends of \$2,000 for certificated staff and \$1,000 for support staff again for this school year. The state will provide these funds to school systems in the fall, and each system will determine their local distribution schedule.
- **Permanent Pay Raise:** While stipends are one-time funds, the legislature also placed a proposal for a permanent raise on the statewide ballot likely in April 2026. If approved by voters, this would mean a raise of about \$2.250 for certificated staff.

We will remain focused on supporting teachers so they can continue helping Louisiana students thrive.

Educator Talent and Workforce Development

Mentor Credential Waiver Portal is OPEN

Please share with school leaders and system leaders.

All teachers who serve as the mentor of an undergraduate or post-baccalaureate candidate must hold the Mentor Certificate or the Provisional Mentor Ancillary Certificate. Prompted by a shortage of credentialed Mentor Teachers willing to host residents specifically in certain content areas, BESE has allowed a waiver of the Mentor Credential since the 2020-2021 school year.

The portals for <u>Traditional Mentor Waivers</u> and <u>Alternate MentorWaivers</u> opened on August 7. The application process will be completed by system leads, mentors, principals, and, in the case of the Alternate Mentor Waiver, education preparation providers.

The New Teacher Experience Professional Learning Modules: Registration is now OPEN Please share with new teachers, school leaders, and school system leaders.

The LDOE, in partnership with A+PEL, has developed monthly <u>professional learning modules</u> on topics that are critical for new teacher success. These modules include online asynchronous content followed by an in-person learning lab where participants practice and apply these concepts.

Teachers must receive approval to attend from their school leader. <u>Registration</u> is now open. Once teachers complete the registration, participants will receive details on selected training locations and an invitation to access the online asynchronous modules.

Louisiana Educator Certification (LEC) Training

LEADS Annual Evaluator Certification Assessment

Please share with data managers, human resource directors, school leaders, and system leaders.

All LEADS evaluators and designated observers must pass an annual assessment in the LDOE Professional Learning Platform before evaluating. Evaluators and observers of teachers are required to take the Louisiana Educator Evaluation Assessment, and evaluators of leaders and counselors are required to take the Louisiana Leader/ Counselor Evaluation Assessment. The assessment must be passed annually to remain in "good standing." Those who do not pass the annual assessment will be required to attend training again before evaluating or observing.

2024-2025 Program Approval Fall Cycle

The new program application window opens **September 1** for the spring cycle for teacher preparation programs, mentor teacher, content leader, and Early Childhood Ancillary Certificate (ECAC). All Notices of Intent (NOIs) are due by **October 1**. NOIs will be reviewed to ensure applicants meet all policy requirements to obtain approval before being moved to the application phase. The application phase will open on October 2, with full applications due December 10.

Numeracy

K-3 Numeracy Screener

Please share with school leaders and system leaders.

In accordance with <u>Act 650 (2024)</u> and <u>Bulletin 118</u>, the LDOE is implementing the K-3 Numeracy Screener. The 2025-2026 school year will serve as a learning year for the screener's administration, with full implementation

scheduled for the 2026–2027 school year. The administration timeline will align with that of the K-3 Literacy Screener, requiring schools to conduct the initial screener within the first 30 days of school.

All school test coordinators and test administrators for the statewide K-3 numeracy screener in KITE must complete the K-3 Numeracy Test Administrator Training, available on the <u>Louisiana Professional Learning Platform</u>. Test administrators must achieve a score of at least 80% and submit their certificate to the school test coordinator. The Test Administrator Training Course Number is F81C9F1F.

Louisiana Achievement in Numeracy Act (LANE)

Please share with teachers, school leaders, and system leaders.

Per Act 260 (2023), all grades 4–8 math teachers must complete an LDOE-approved numeracy course by August 1, 2025. School and system leaders must collect proof of completion from new hires teaching these grades. Act 353 of 2025 (LANE) extends this requirement to K–3 math teachers by August 2027. A course for high school math teachers is available, but not mandatory.

Courses remain open through 2025–2026, and system contacts have received course codes. See the <u>Guidance and Framing</u> document on the <u>Louisiana Math webpage</u> for guidance. Systems should plan to support teachers in meeting these requirements.

ACT and DCAI Data Certification

Data certification for ACT and DCAI opened on August 22 in La Data Review and will remain available through September 5 for requests to change data that will be used in the fall 2025 school performance score (SPS). This is the final opportunity for schools and systems to review and request changes to data. Once data certification closes, data that could have been changed during this certification period cannot be used to file an appeal or waiver of the SPS.

2025-2026 Local Charter Request for Applications Cycle

Please share with school system leaders and LEA charter authorizers.

The 2025-2026 Common Charter Application, timeline, and supporting documentation are published and available on the LDOE website. Districts are required to provide an application process outline and a point of contact for applicant submission for interested applicants on district websites.

The Office of School Choice requests that each district complete the <u>Charter Authorizing Contact Information Survey</u> by September 8 to ensure the most up-to-date information for the point of contact for LEA Charter Authorization.

Key Dates for Local Authorizers:

- September 8: Deadline to post application materials to website
- October 20: Charter Applications are due to districts
- November 7: Local boards notify LDOE and legislators of charter applications received within each district
- January 29: Deadline to consider charter applications
- January 30: Deadline to notify LDOE of local board recommendations

If the district has not made a decision by January 29, the applicant is eligible to appeal to BESE.
