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Message from the State Superintendent

Louisiana Teachers.

Through <u>Let Teachers Teach</u>, you told us that too often your time and energy were being pulled away from student instruction, whether by disruptions in the classroom or by the need to recreate materials instead of teaching. We listened, and changes are now in place to support you.

Stronger Support with Discipline

- **Immediate support:** Administrators are required to remove disruptive students from your classroom when requested so you can keep teaching.
- **Clear consequences:** After a second suspension, schools must provide additional behavioral support. After three suspensions, the student will be recommended for expulsion.
- **Cell phones banned:** Teachers identified cell phones as the number one classroom disruption. A state law now requires they be turned off during instructional time, and teachers have already reported positive results where this has been enforced.
- Parental engagement: Stronger policies require parents to be engaged earlier when behavior concerns arise
- Your role affirmed: Teachers can be confident in holding firm expectations, knowing schools and systems are required to back you up.

Instructional Focus

- **High-quality resources:** A <u>statewide repository</u> of easy-to-access resources is being updated with lessons, pacing, and support materials. Many are now available on our <u>redesigned LDOE website</u>, built with teacher input to make it more user-friendly.
- Aligned curriculum: More guidance is available to help ensure all students are taught grade-level content with fidelity.
- Time protected: By cutting duplication and improving access to resources, more of your day is freed up for teaching and supporting students.

These changes respect your role as a professional and let you keep student learning at the center of your classroom. They also reflect the leadership of school and system leaders working to back their teachers every day.

Louisiana's academic progress is proof that when teachers are supported, students thrive.

2025-2026 Title I, Part A - Annual Comparability Reports

Please share with federal program directors and superintendents.

The LDOE will release the 2025-2026 SY Title I Comparability Report section in eGMS on September 15. Title I Comparability requires school systems to demonstrate that services provided with state and local funds are comparable between both Title I schools and non-Title I schools, or are substantially comparable for school systems with all Title I schools. School systems with one school per grade span and single-site school systems (i.e., Type 2, 3, 3B, and 5 charters) are exempt from this submission.

School systems should use October 2024 staffing and salary data to complete this report. Please access Comparability Instructions for further details on how to complete the report. School systems may also use the Comparability Workbook in order to do some preliminary testing. The completed report should be submitted via eGMS by December 19.

Charter Schools

<u>2025-2026 Annual RFA Charter Application Website Posting Requirements</u> Please share with LEA charter authorizers and school system leaders.

BESE approved the 2025-2026 Common Charter Application and application timeline on August 19. Local authorizers were invited to attend the local authorizer monthly call on August 13 to review the applications, timeline, and application tools for application review.

As part of the local authorization process, district websites must provide potential applicants with the following information:

- Forms required for submission of a charter proposal eligibility documents and common charter application with any local additions
- Timeline for accepting and reviewing charter proposals at the district level
- The process that will be used to review charter proposals submitted to the board
- The name and contact information for a primary point of contact for charter proposals

The <u>website template</u> has been created for district use. Usage of the template is entirely optional; each district may also choose to create and post district text in accordance with Bulletin 126. In accordance with the requirements to make public the guidelines for submitting a charter proposal, district websites will be reviewed for compliance beginning September 9.
