Louisiana Legislative Youth Advisory Council (LYAC) Applications

<u>The Legislative Youth Advisory Council (LYAC)</u> is a body created by state law that is composed entirely of high school students with an interest in representing the voices of young people across the state. It opens the line of communication between youth and the legislature and gives students the opportunity to be involved in the workings of government. The thirty-one student members are appointed each year, three from each of the state's congressional districts and the remaining members at large. The Louisiana Commission on Civic Education oversees the work of LYAC and selects its membership. LYAC is now accepting membership <u>applications</u> for the 2025-2026 school year. <u>A recommendation form and letter(s)</u> must accompany the membership application in order to be considered. The deadline for submission is March 28.

Charter Schools <u>2024-2025 Annual RFA Application Cycle for Type 2 & 4 Charters</u> Please share with school and system leaders.

The 2024-2025 Annual RFA Application Cycle for Type 2 and 4 charters slated to open August 2026 will open February 3. Applicants must meet the eligibility requirements listed in <u>LA Bulletin 126, §503</u>. Application deadlines are as follows:

- Letters of Intent due: February 10 by 5 p.m. (emailed to: <u>charters@la.gov</u>)
- Eligibility determination forms due: March 10 by 5 p.m. (emailed to: charters@la.gov)
- Submission deadline for the full application for Types 2 and 4 applicants: March 31
- BESE considers applications for Type 2 and 4 new charter schools: August 19

Applicants must meet each of the listed deadlines to be permitted to move to the next component of the application cycle.

2025-2026 BESE and Brumfield v Dodd Approval Application Open

Please share with nonpublic school leaders.

Nonpublic schools seeking state approval must apply annually for approval by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE). To become eligible for LA GATOR funding, schools must be approved by BESE and also comply with Brumfield vs. Dodd, a federal court order that prohibits discrimination.

The <u>2025-2026 BESE Approval Application</u> will be open from January 27 through February 13. Late applications will not be accepted.
