### **BOY K-3 Literacy Gifted Referral Data Collection**

Please share with gifted coordinators and special education leaders.

Louisiana Statute 17:24.9 mandates school systems to report the number of students identified for referral for gifted evaluation for every literacy screening administration for grades K-3. The following data sets will be collected for each grade level:

- The number of gifted students scoring in the above-average range on the literacy screener.
- The number of non-gifted students referred for additional screening.
- The number of non-gifted students referred for gifted evaluation.

**BOY reporting** is due October 13.

### Annual Dyslexia Reporting

Please share with special education leaders.

School systems are required to annually report the number of students with dyslexia currently enrolled and the number of students newly identified with dyslexia in the prior school year. The <u>dyslexia reporting form</u> will open on October 1. All school systems must submit the dyslexia reporting form by December 15.

### Professional Learning Modules: Registration OPEN for Modules 2-5

# **High-Dosage Tutoring Outcome-Based Contracting**

School systems may soon apply for additional Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring funds to extend high-dosage tutoring through outcome-based contracting (OBC). OBC must be with external tutoring providers to support an additional 10-week tutoring cycle. System leaders are asked to complete this OBC Interest Form by October 10. The tutoring team will reach out to those completing the form to answer questions and discuss next steps.

# **Career and College Readiness**

#### **Crisis Management and Response Plans**

Please share with school system leaders.

Act 334 of the 2023 Regular Legislative session requires the following:

- The local school superintendent is to make an annual report to the public school governing authority on the status of the crisis management and response plan of each school under the governing authority's iurisdiction.
- Submit a copy of the report to LDOE and the Center for Safe Schools.

All documents should be submitted electronically via the <u>Data Management FTP</u> site. Please email <u>healthyschools@la.gov</u> when your FTP coordinator has uploaded the files. Crisis Management and Response Plans should be submitted on or before October 31.

## **Discipline Reporting**

Please share with counselors, system leaders, and data managers.

Act 497 (2025) amended R.S. 17:416.B or C requires school systems to report expulsion data, including the number of occasions for committing offenses in sections B or C. Therefore, student discipline data should be accurate and current in the local SIS and should be reported to LDOE daily. Data managers are encouraged to automate the SIS to upload student data on a daily basis. The LDOE will monitor discipline submissions and contact school systems that are not submitting on a regular schedule.

### **AI-Powered Python Pilot**

Please share with system leaders, CTE supervisors, and Information Technology teachers.

The LDOE, in partnership with Bossier Parish Community College and Kira Learning, is launching a two-year pilot to expand AI-powered CTE education in Python Programming. Up to 15 school systems will be selected to participate. Educators in the pilot will receive professional development, ongoing support, and access to Python-aligned curriculum and AI tools.

The <u>application window</u> will run from October 7 to 22, with final selections targeted for November 7. The pilot officially begins on December 12, with spring 2026 focused on building teacher fluency through hands-on training and support. Selected school systems will have flexibility through rolling enrollment, allowing them to add additional teachers as they prepare for the 2026–2027 school year.

### 2025-2026 U.S. Senate Youth Scholarship Opportunity Deadline Extended

Please share with social studies supervisors, secondary administrators, counselors, charter, nonpublic, and student council advisors.

The LDOE, in partnership with the William Randolph Hearst Foundation, will select two juniors or seniors to serve as delegates for the 64th Annual Washington Week Program, March 7-14, 2026. These two students will each receive a \$10,000 scholarship after attending all sessions scheduled for that week. All information is currently available on our website.

- Any junior or senior holding an elected or appointed leadership position at school, in the community, in the state, or in the nation may qualify to <a href="mailto:apply">apply</a>.
- The application will be posted on the <u>website</u>. Once the <u>application</u> has been submitted, it will trigger the release of the list of essay topics and directions for the proctored writing session to the school sponsor. These topics are considered test-secure by the Hearst Foundation and should be treated accordingly.
- The deadline for portfolio submission has been extended to **October 10 at 11:59 p.m.** <u>Applications</u> will not be returned. Finalists will be notified by October 20.
- The national exam and interviews will be held on November 6 in Baton Rouge.
- Finalists will be notified by our office in December of their selection as a delegate or an alternate for the week of March 7-14. 2026.
- The delegates must be able to attend all scheduled events in Washington, D.C., from March 7 to 14, 2026, to receive the college scholarship.

#### FY 2025-2026 First Quarter Financial Report

The FY 2025-2026 First Quarter Financial Report for Type 2 and Type 5 charter schools is due on October 31. The quarterly report template is included in the workbook used to submit the annual operating budget. Charter systems are required to submit the entire workbook with updates to the Quarter 1 Budget tab. The First Quarter Financial Report should contain year-to-date actual information from July 1, 2025 to September 30, 2025, along with budgeted data for FY 2025-2026. If an organization operates more than one charter school, a separate financial report must be submitted for each charter school.

All applicants are encouraged to ensure that the Nonpublic Textbooks contact information is updated and saved in eGMS. Please ensure that orders for textbooks, etc. are received by the eligible nonpublic school during the period of July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026 to be eligible for reimbursement.
