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Message from the Superintendent

Dear Colleagues,

Louisiana education is near the top of another national study. <u>This new report</u> ranked Louisiana fourth in the nation when adjusting the most recent Nation's Report Card for student demographics such as income, ethnicity, exceptionalities, and language barriers. Published since 2015, the study adapts data from the national assessment based on differences across states.

Among the takeaways in the new report:

- Louisiana ranked fourth overall. Other states in the top five are Florida, Texas, Mississippi, and Massachusetts. In this same report from 2019, Louisiana ranked 20th overall.
- Louisiana's relative performance grew more than any other state and is one of nine states to improve by more than 10 points.
- Louisiana fourth graders ranked fifth in math and fourth in reading.
- Louisiana eighth graders ranked fifth in math and second in reading.

Whether it's this study, the <u>Education Recovery Scorecard</u>, <u>U.S. News & World Report</u>, or <u>our own state assessments</u>, there is solid data showing the progress we see every day in Louisiana. We should all be proud, but far from satisfied. Our state is poised to accelerate if we can continue to make the type of brave decisions that move us forward.

2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA)

FBI New Orleans, Tulane University Police Department, and the Louisiana Chapter of the FBI National Academy are proud to announce the introduction of the 2025 Future Law Enforcement Youth Academy (FLEYA) to Louisiana. Two of the nation's most notable and iconic institutions will conduct law enforcement and legal training for selected youth from Louisiana.

The FLEYA training program will be a FREE weeklong overnight camp exposing students (15 to 17 years of age) to federal, state, and local law enforcement practices. This joint effort promotes law enforcement career paths by giving the selected youths an inside look at the various procedures and techniques taught by subject matter experts and agency instructors. Tulane's Uptown campus will serve as the home base for an academic environment with the premier atmosphere to encourage students to pursue higher education and careers in law enforcement.

FLEYA Eligibility Criteria

- United States citizen residing in the state of Louisiana
- Currently enrolled in a Louisiana high school
- 15 to 17 years old at the time of FLEYA, which will be held June 1-6
- Minimum GPA of 2.7
- Must be present each day of the FLEYA program

A <u>completed application</u> in entirety and essay must be submitted in PDF form to <u>LouisianaFLEYA@fbi.gov</u>. No Google Docs or applications requiring a password to access will be accepted. This program is only for current high school students. Students graduating from high school in the spring of 2025 are not eligible.
