The New Teacher Experience: Professional Learning Modules

Please share with new teachers, school leaders, and system leaders.

The LDOE, in partnership with A+PEL, has developed monthly professional learning modules on topics that are critical for new teacher success. These modules include online asynchronous content followed by an in-person learning lab where participants practice and apply these concepts. These five modules are designed to build learning throughout the year. Teachers are expected to complete the entire series of Professional Learning Modules.

- Module 1: Classroom Management/Classroom Environment
- Module 2: Standards and Curriculum
- Module 3: Data Literacy
- Module 4: Literacy for 21st Century Learners
- Module 5: Parent and Community Engagement

This year, the LDOE is offering 245 complimentary seats. Half are reserved for the northern location (Monroe) and half for the southern location (Port Allen). Once those seats are exhausted, teachers may still attend but there will be a cost of \$1,272.00 per teacher to complete the series of modules. Teachers will be asked to receive approval to attend from their school leader.

<u>Registration</u> is now open. Once teachers complete the registration, participants will receive details on selected training locations. Participants will also receive an invitation to access the online asynchronous modules.

2024-2025 Program Approval Spring Cycle

New program application window will open September 1 for the spring cycle for teacher preparation programs, mentor teacher, content leader, and ECAC. All Notice of Intents are due by October 1. Applications will be reviewed to ensure applicants meet all policy requirements to obtain approval before being moved to the application phase. Full applications for all new programs are due December 10.

Third Grade Promotion Act Guidance

Career and College Readiness

U.S. Senate Youth Scholarship Opportunity

Please share with counselors, secondary administrators, social studies supervisors, and student council advisors.

The LDOE, in partnership with the William Randolph Hearst Foundation, will select two juniors or seniors to serve as delegates for the 63rd Annual Washington Week Program March 1-8. These two students will each receive a \$10,000 scholarship after attending all sessions scheduled for that week. All information is currently available on the LDOE website.

- Any junior or senior holding an elected or appointed leadership position at school, in the community, in the state, or the nation may qualify to apply.
- The Jotform application will be posted on the <u>Louisiana Department of Education website</u> by August 15. Once the application has been submitted, it will trigger the release of the list of essay topics and directions for the proctored writing session from the state coordinator to the school sponsor. These topics are considered test secure by the Hearst Foundation and are to be treated as such.
- The deadline for portfolio submission is October 4, at 11:59 p.m. Applications will not be returned. Finalists will be notified by October 25.

The national exam and interviews will be held on November 8 in Baton Rouge. Finalists will be notified by the LDOE in December of their selection as a delegate or an alternate for the week of March 1-8. The delegates must be able to attend all scheduled events in Washington D.C. the week of March 1-8 to receive the college scholarship.

National School Bus Curriculum Training

Please share with occupational therapists, physical therapists, special education administrators, and transportation administrators.

The LDOE is offering an opportunity for school systems to send a team of 4 personnel for training on Child Passenger Safety. School teams should consist of one personnel from each department: transportation administrators, special education administrators, occupational therapists, and physical therapists. Registration is now open, and will be closed when the maximum capacity of 20 participants is reached.

The <u>National School Bus Curriculum</u> is an 8 hour course that provides an overview of the use of child safety restraint systems on school buses, with a focus on children with disabilities and chronic conditions.

Participants will:

- learn about federal, state and local laws, crash dynamics and forces, and occupant protection
- learn about the types of occupant protection that can be used on school buses, and gain knowledge on appropriate team assessments that lead to the appropriate selection of child safety restraints
- gain knowledge and skills through practice time that includes safely installing the child safety restraint system on the bus, and properly securing the occupant
- learn about securement of wheelchairs, and emergency evacuation procedures
