systems must complete the Teacher Leader Summit 2026 Registration Check Submission Request form to obtain

Public Notice – ESEA Waiver Request

Please share with system and district leaders.

At its October 2025 meeting, the Louisiana Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) directed the LDOE to request authorization from the U.S. Department of Education to waive the requirement in section 1111(b)(2)(C)(iii) of the ESEA that requires a State implementing the exception for advanced mathematics in middle school to use a student's performance on:

- 1. The end-of-course high school mathematics assessment in the year in which the eighth-grade student takes the assessment for purposes of measuring academic achievement and participation for statewide accountability; and
- 2. A more advanced high school mathematics assessment in the year in which the student takes that assessment for purposes of measuring academic achievement and participation for statewide accountability.

As an alternative, BESE, through LDOE, is requesting a waiver of the requirements in ESEA section 1111(b)(2)(C) and the corresponding regulation 34 CFR § 200.5(b) during a two-year transition period over the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 school years.

Assessments, Accountability, and Analytics

Cameras in Classroom During Testing

Please share with testing coordinators and school leaders.

ACT strictly forbids the use of cameras in classrooms that are administering ACT. Cameras should be turned off.

For LEAP and K-3 screening:

- In order to ensure compliance with department agreements to maintain the industry standard security on test items, no recording of items, derivatives of items, or readings of items is permissible.
- Any camera which records or broadcasts in any way must be positioned such that any screen being used for the assessment is not visible to the camera.

• In any classroom within which "test-read aloud" is provided, students must use headphones, the audio recording must be disabled, or the student who requires test-read aloud without headphones must be tested in an alternate location where audio recording does not occur.

ACT

ACT has introduced new assessments beginning in the 2025-2026 school year.

What's Changing?

- Shorter tests 44 fewer questions
- More time per question
- Shorter reading passages
- Mathematics section now has four answer choices instead of five

What's Staying the Same?

- Core content and subject areas remain the same
- Same skills and knowledge assessed
- Reading section still measures comprehension and analysis
- No impact on predicting First-Year college success
- Both paper and online tests still offered (no paper option for state spring administration)

Course Choice Family Awareness Campaign

Charter Schools

<u>2025-2026 Local Charter Request for Applications Cycle - Reporting Deadline</u> Please share with school system leaders and LEA charter authorizers.

Local authorizers are required to report any Type 1 and 3 application submissions to the LDOE by November 7. Local authorizers are required to report the following information regarding charter applications received in their district:

- Non-profit foundation name of applicant
- Proposed charter school name
- Name of primary applicant
- Date application submitted

Information regarding applicants being considered may be submitted to the LDOE using the <u>Applicant Submission</u> <u>Notice form</u>. Additionally, local authorizers are required to notify state legislators of charter applications received within each district.

Per August 2024 Bulletin 126 update, applicants are now also required to report their submission to the local authorizer and may use the <u>Applicant Submission Notice form</u>. Local authorizers may provide this information to any applicant who has submitted an application to their district for the 2025-2026 RFA process.

Upcoming Key Dates for Local Authorizers

- November 7, 2025: Local boards notify LDOE and state legislators of charter applications received within each district
- January 29, 2026: Deadline to consider charter applications
- January 30, 2026: Deadline to notify LDOE of local board recommendations

School System Financial Services

70% Instructional Expenditure Requirement

Please share with business managers and financial officials.

Per the MFP Resolution, school systems must ensure that 70% of the local school system general fund expenditures are in the areas of instruction, pupil and instructional support, and school administration at the school building level. Compliance with this expenditure requirement is calculated annually.

The results of the FY 2023-24 70% Instructional Expenditure Requirement will be available via the edFin FTP site by November 7, 2025. Systems are encouraged to review their reports and notify the Office of School Systems Financial Services of any questionable reporting before November 19, 2025.

BESE will receive a report of the results for all school systems at the January 2026 meeting. Systems that are not in compliance with this requirement will be required to submit a Corrective Action Plan to the Office of School Systems Financial Services by December 12.
