Louisiana elementary schools are receiving a special delivery: a set of instructional math flashcards for K–5 teachers. More than just a classroom resource, these cards represent something much greater — our back-to-basics focus on building a strong foundation in math for every student.

Flashcards are simple, effective, and timeless. When used intentionally, they support fluency, reinforce strategies, and help students build the confidence and skills they need to take on more advanced math. They are especially helpful for students who benefit from extra practice with foundational concepts.

This resource is part of Louisiana's broader strategy to improve math outcomes statewide. We know that student performance in math often declines between grades 4 and 8. That is why we are committed to reversing that trend by providing tools that work, supporting teachers, and setting a clear expectation: every student can succeed in math.

High Cost Services Round 1

During Round 1, school systems can request reimbursement for their current students who were also enrolled in the 2024-2025 school year. The deadline to submit a Round 1 application is **November 11**.

BOY K-3 Literacy Gifted Referral Data Collection

Louisiana Statute 17:24.9 mandates school systems to report the number of students identified for referral for gifted evaluation for every literacy screening administration for grades K-3. The deadline to submit BOY K-3 literacy gifted referral data was October 13. Any school system that did not submit by the deadline must submit their BOY data by October 17.

The Compass Information System (CIS) will be permanently shut down on November 3. After this date, educators and school systems will no longer have access to evaluation data within the CIS platform.

To prepare for the shutdown, please communicate with employees to ensure they use View Only mode to download all past evaluations.

The LDOE will retain all evaluation data, including effectiveness data, to support application processing. After the shutdown, system leaders may contact <u>LEADS@la.gov</u> to confirm past evaluations for certification purposes. Historical data and attachments will be moved into LES in the coming months.

Assessment Development Educator Review Committees

The Office of Assessments, Accountability and Analytics will convene assessment committees for the LEAP and LEAP Connect assessments in January and February to:

- review newly developed LEAP Connect items for alignment and content-related criteria, and
- review Science and English language arts proposed stimuli/passages to ensure content alignment, the selections are clearly worded with grade-appropriate language, and the selections are appropriate for all Louisiana students.

Career and College Readiness

Internship Funding

Please share with high school principals, counselors, CTE, and secondary supervisors.

Funding is available to offset the costs of delivering internship programming to students. The allocation is \$1,000 per eligible student enrolled in an internship program that meets policy requirements. To request this funding, students must be enrolled in the Course Choice portal in an LDOE Internship Course. In addition, an attestation must be completed and sent to coursechoice@la.gov, and all required documentation must be on file at the local level and available for review. The deadline for reporting full-year and fall enrollments is October 31. Payment for this round of funding will occur in January.

Charter Schools

2025-2026 Local Charter Request for Applications Cycle - Applications Due

Please share with school system leaders and LEA charter authorizers.

On October 20, all Type 1 and 3 applications will be due to local authorizers at the district level. Local Authorizers are required to report the following information regarding charter applications received in their district:

- Nonprofit foundation name of applicant
- Proposed charter school name
- Name of primary applicant
- Date application submitted

Information regarding applicants being considered by local authorizers is due to LDOE by November 7, using the Jotform <u>link</u>. Additionally, local authorizers are required to notify state legislators of charter applications received within each district.

Per the August 2024 Bulletin 126 update, applicants are now also required to report their submission to the local authorizer and may use the Jotform <u>link</u>. Local authorizers may provide this information to any applicant who has submitted an application to their district for the 2025-2026 RFA process.

Decisions regarding approval or denial of each applicant are due to LDOE by January 30.

Upcoming Key Dates for Local Authorizers:

- October 20: Charter Applications due to districts
- November 7: Local boards notify LDOE and state legislators of charter applications received within each district
- January 29: Deadline to consider charter applications

• January 30: Deadline to notify LDOE of local board recommendations
