


The Nation's Report Card

- National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)—also known as The Nation's Report
 Card—assesses 4th and 8th graders in reading and math
- Math and reading assessments in grades 4 and 8 conducted every two years since 2003
- Suspended since 2019 due to pandemic
- Largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students in the United
 States know and can do in various subject areas
- 2022 assessments administered between January and March


