• Teacher Access for grades 3-8 Math Interim 2 is now available. The Interim Quick Start Guide has been updated with usernames and passwords.

#### ACT

- Through February 2
  - STCs request ACT-approved accommodations in the Test Accessibility and Accommodations System (TAA).
  - STCs verify and upload student data in PearsonAccessnext (PANext) for ACT
  - STCs order ACT WorkKeys accommodation materials in PANext
- New high schools who have not received an ACT school code should submit requests using this link: <u>ACT/SAT</u>

#### Common High School Code Request

• Requests should be submitted by the school and will take approximately three weeks to process.

#### ACT Online

- Through February 2
  - Install ProctorCache software and setup proctor caching in PANext (ACT online only) Note: the administration will be switched from online to paper if ProctorCache software is not installed by this deadline.
  - Complete a mock administration (ACT online only)

#### WorkKeys

• The<u>Score Reporting Schedule</u> document contains complete information about the score reports ACT will produce and when test coordinators can expect to receive them.

#### Fall High School Testing

- LEAP 2025 and EOC High School testing window is open now through December 15.
- Test administrators and proctors should be familiar with the <u>technical troubleshooting tips</u> if an issue arises.
- The only students who are eligible to take the four-level U.S. History EOC are students who are graduating in 2017-2018

and retesters who are not repeating the course. EOC tests taken for courses earned prior to 2017-2018 will be accepted. For more information, consult the <u>2017-2018 High School Assessment Frequently Asked Questions</u>.

• Students with accommodations in SER and SIS will be uploaded by DRC. Non-pre identified students must be added to eDIRECT manually. Test coordinators need to manually enter Read Aloud accommodations for students with accommodations in SIS. Students with Read Aloud accommodations in SER will be populated in eDIRECT. STCs will manually select accommodations or accessibility features in eDIRECT for students that have PNP or LEP accommodations. STCs should review and verify student accommodations in eDIRECT prior to creating test sessions.

# New: Strategies for Success: A Guidebook for Supporting Students with Disabilities

The Department released <u>Strategies for Success: A Guidebook for Supporting Students with Disabilities</u>, to provide site and school system leaders with resources to create strong support plans for students with disabilities. It can also be used to assist in applications for Round Two of School Redesign Grants. The guidebook is organized around four proven strategies for improving the academic achievement of students with disabilities:

- Identify disabilities early and accurately;
- Provide high-quality instruction to ensure the achievement of ambitious IEP goals;
- Strengthen instruction with specialized supports and related services; and,
- Coordinate effective transition planning and implementation

## Reminder: USDOE Releases New Emergency Management Tool

The U.S. Department of Education's Readiness and Emergency Management for Schools Technical Assistance Center has released <u>SITE ASSESS</u>, an interactive tool designed to support school systems with emergency management and emergency operations plan (EOP) development.

SITE ASSESS is a mobile tool that allows school and school system personnel to walk around school buildings and grounds and examine their safety, security, accessibility, and emergency preparedness. It generates a customized to-do list that may be used to address facility improvements, prompts teams to share pertinent information with first responders, and contains relevant resources on several education facility and safety topics.
