## Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) School Safety Training

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) School Safety will host a <u>virtual training</u> on enhancing behavioral threat assessment and management (BTAM) practices in kindergarten through 12th-grade (K-12) schools. The training will take place on October 16, from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. EDT. This session will explore how K-12 leaders can build and strengthen BTAM processes that promote early intervention and prevent school violence, especially when embedded within a comprehensive multi-tiered system of support. A panel of experts will share strategies for forming an effective BTAM team, defining roles, and fostering collaboration among school staff, mental health professionals, and law enforcement partners.

Training will be relevant to school and district administrators, K-12 school security staff, emergency management professionals, school resource officers, and school-based law enforcement personnel, state and local law enforcement, parents and guardians, and other members of the school safety community.

#### **Pupil Progression Plans**

The Louisiana <u>Bulletin 1566</u> requires local education agencies (LEAs) to establish a comprehensive <u>Pupil Progression Plan (PPP)</u> that addresses student placement and promotion. The PPP should be based on student performance on the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program (LEAP), with goals and objectives that are compatible with the Louisiana Competency-Based Education Program and which supplement the minimum standards approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE).

Pupil Progression Plans should be submitted as a PDF to ppp@la.gov by October 31.

### **Discipline Reporting**

Please share with counselors, system leaders, and data managers.

Act 497 (2025) amended R.S. 17:416.BorC requiring school systems to report expulsion data, including the number of occasions for committing offenses in sections B or C. Therefore, student discipline data should be accurate and current in the local SIS and should be reported to LDOE daily. Data managers are encouraged to automate the SIS to upload student data daily. The LDOE will monitor discipline submissions and contact school systems that are not submitting on a regular schedule.

## **Q & A With Counselor Connect!**

**Question:** How can I ensure that students enrolled in work-based learning courses are coded correctly for accountability?

**Answer:** Course codes for any work-based learning course can be found on the Work-Based Learning guidance document located on the LDOE site.

**Question**: Can students be assigned a pass or fail grade for work-based learning courses? **Answer**: No, students must be assigned a letter grade for all work-based learning courses.

## **Scholarship/Funding Opportunities**

Scholarship awards can range significantly, from modest amounts, such as \$50-\$500, from local organizations to substantial sums, including full tuition, from larger institutions. Smaller scholarships, despite their lesser amounts, can be a great way to secure funding and often have fewer applicants.
