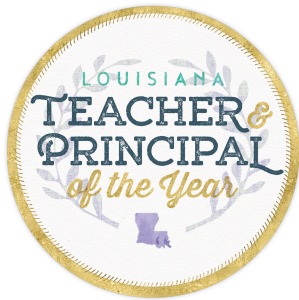
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## PRINCIPAL CORNER

Below you will find the abbreviated bios for each of the *2025 Principal of the Year Finalists*.



#### **S. Chad Schulz, Beauregard Parish**

S. Chad Schulz is the principal of South Beauregard Elementary School in Longville, LA. Schulz received his Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education and a Masters degree from McNeese State University. His focus on early literacy is a direct predictor of a student's success. Schulz's "big picture" vision remains while providing strategic skills and reinforcements so students have the foundation for their future.



**Shonna Anderson, Calcasieu Parish**

Dr. Shonna Anderson is the principal of Ray D. Molo Middle Magnet School in Lake Charles. ## **Act 260 Numeracy Training Updates**

In accordance with Act 260, the LDOE has created a full suite of Numeracy Professional Learning courses for K-12 math teachers. The LDOE plans to release the first five modules for each Numeracy course this summer. For educators to access the courses within the Canopy Professional Learning Platform, superintendents must have opted-in through EdLink Security to grant all classroom teachers a role in Canopy.

Once this step is completed, teachers and staff should follow the steps below to create an EdLink Security account.

- Step 1: Create MyLa Credentials
- Step 2: Create EdLink User Profile
