LEADS Corner

We have concluded the LER and LLR trainings. Your passion and engagement throughout the trainings demonstrate your dedication towards advancing student achievement. Just a reminder to follow the steps in the LEADS certification email to complete the certification assessment so that you may begin your observations as soon as possible. As we move through the learning year, below are a few steps to continue a smooth transition to LEADS.

- Schools orient educators to the Evaluation Learning Year components and processes.
- School leaders develop a long-range plan for the instructional leadership team to build depth-of-knowledge, inter-rater reliability, and coaching and feedback skills.
- School leaders develop a long-range plan for teacher collaboration professional learning opportunities, where educators/teachers build LER depth-of knowledge and self-assessment skills.
- Designated observers and evaluators of educators develop and implement an observation schedule for
 educator evaluation that account for the length of the cycle, a pre-conference (announced observation only),
 observation, observer of record, post-conference, data entry, and follow-up coaching cycle).

Educational Leadership Alternative Pathway 4 LDOE Training

The Educational Leadership (EDL) Alternative Pathway 4 offers a unique opportunity for current MPA, MBA, or JD holders, and honorably discharged commissioned officers from the US military to obtain an Educational Leadership Certificate. To be eligible, candidates must complete training provided by the LDOE and have passed either the School Leadership Licensure Assessment or the Louisiana Leadership Assessment Series. For the 2024-2025 academic year, interested applicants should complete the application.

The pathway requirements state that candidates must be provided a mentor to support their induction and transition into the Educational Leadership role. The LDOE is currently seeking mentors to support these candidates. Any current school/system leaders interested in serving as a mentor for novice principals are encouraged to complete the mentor application by **October 25**.

Educator Certification Resources and Updates to Online Certification Portal

<u>Certification Bulletin, Bulletin 746</u> and the <u>Online Teacher Certification Portal, Teach LA Live!</u> support educators in maintaining their certification.

The online certification portal allows educators to submit certification applications (where allowed in policy), or connect with a Certification Specialist to <u>ask questions</u>. Current application processing time is approximately 15-25 business days. Question responses are provided via email in approximately 3-5 business days. The portal question and application system will be redesigned and implemented in phases. Phase 1 includes the updating of the question submission system. The testing window occurred this summer and full implementation is set for August. End users will need a <u>MyLa account</u> to submit questions in the new system.

Zearn Checkpoint

Now is the time to set expectations and check data for <u>Zearn implementation</u> in the classroom. Reflect on the key factors of planning, behavior management, engagement, and goal setting using the Zearn Class Reports. Reflecting on this data supports teacher success with the <u>high-impact tool</u>, Zearn.

Consider the following:

- Are teachers and students signing in to Zearn regularly?
- Are students getting 90 minutes per week with Zearn?
- Are students completing three grade-level Zearn lessons per week?

Also, <u>Zearn/Louisiana Leader Collaboration</u> is scheduled monthly on Tuesdays throughout the school year to discuss implementation with leaders from systems across the state. The next meeting is <u>September 17 at 9 am</u>.

The DIBELS Professional Development Series for K-3 Literacy Educators takes teachers and leaders from administering the benchmarks, all the way through using DIBELS as an instructional lever with training on grouping, progress monitoring, and intervening with integrity.
