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LEADS Corner

As you continue through the LEADS process, observations are conducted to provide feedback and foster professional growth. The <u>Formal Observation Cycle of Support</u> demonstrates how the PGP/Coaching Plan extends and supports the identified refinement area. Your passion with this process shows your dedication towards advancing student achievement. Below are a few steps to continue a smooth transition to LEADS.

- School leaders develop a long-range plan for teacher collaboration and professional learning opportunities, where educators/teachers build LER depth of knowledge and self-assessment skills.
- Designated observers/evaluators conduct the first cycle of observations and the subsequent follow-up coaching and support cycle.
- School instructional leadership teams conduct trend analysis with observation data from the first cycle of educator observations.

2023-2024 Evaluation Close-Out

All 2023-2024 evaluations for teachers, counselors, and librarians must be finalized in <u>CIS</u> by November 29. Leader evaluations will be due following the release of School Performance Scores (SPS) later this winter.

As a reminder, all 2024-2025 evaluation data should be entered directly into the Louisiana Evaluation System (LES) for all schools, regardless of the chosen evaluation type; there will be no transfer of scores or spreadsheet uploads. It is encouraged to collaborate with your LES system contact to ensure that you have the correct access for LES to enter your observation data.

Teacher and Principal of the Year Application Online Portals Are Now Open

The online portals for coordinators and state-level applicants for Teacher and Principal of the Year are now open. All application materials and links to the online portals are available in the <u>Library</u> and on the <u>Awards</u> page.

All school systems are encouraged to select up to three teachers and three principals, one per division (elementary, middle, and high), as their local-level honorees and submit these selections to the state process. School systems without a formal selection process in place may elect to send their candidates directly to the state-level process. State-level applications are **due by January 15** and must be submitted via the online application portal.

Act 260 Numeracy Professional Learning Checkpoint

Teachers statewide are making progress in completing the <u>Act 260 Numeracy Course</u>. As educators work through the course, they should consider the following tips:

- Teachers on pace to meet the August 2025 deadline should complete Modules 7 and 8 by the end of November.
- Participants should engage with thoughtful replies in discussions. Inaccurate or incomplete replies will be deleted, removing the progress made in the course.
- The post-test is now available. Teachers who have completed all 25 modules may now complete the post-test and print their certificates.

Zearn Reminders

Regular monitoring and reflection on the key factors of planning, behavior management, engagement, and goal setting are essential to supporting <u>Zearn implementation</u>.

Admin Reports allow leaders to monitor the following information:

- Are teachers and students signing in to Zearn regularly?
- Are students getting 90 minutes per week with Zearn?
- Are students completing three grade-level Zearn lessons per week?

Bayou Bridges Instructional Slide Decks

The LDOE is developing instructional slide decks to support the implementation of <u>Bayou Bridges</u> in grades 3-8. These Bayou Bridges instructional slide decks follow the Core Lesson of each chapter in each unit, providing teachers and students with access to the Big Idea; framing Questions; literal, inferential, and evaluative questions; visuals; checks for understanding; and scaffolded supports all in one convenient location.

Teachers should use the instructional decks along with the Student Reader as they implement the Core Lesson of each chapter to increase engagement, assist in lesson pacing, and complete formative checks for understanding. Slide decks can be accessed under grade-level materials on the <u>Bayou Bridges</u> webpage. The LDOE has released units 1 and 3 slide decks and will release the remaining units on a rolling basis throughout the school year.

National Training on Child Passenger Safety

The LDOE is offering school districts the opportunity to send a team of four personnel for national training on Child Passenger Safety. Registration for <u>Special Education Transportation Training 2024 - 2025</u> is now open. School teams attending should consist of transportation administrators, special education administrators, occupational therapists, and physical therapists. There are new opportunities for training throughout the state during the Spring of 2025. All sessions will be held from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The <u>National School Bus Curriculum</u> is an eight-hour course that provides an overview of the use of child safety restraint systems on school buses, focusing on children with disabilities and chronic conditions. Participants will:

- learn about federal, state, and local laws, crash dynamics and forces, and occupant protection;
- learn about the types of occupant protection that can be used on school buses;
- gain knowledge on appropriate team assessments that lead to the appropriate selection of child safety restraints for individuals with disabilities who travel to school on buses;
- gain knowledge and skills through practice time that includes safely installing the child safety restraint system on the bus and also properly securing the occupant; and
- Learn about the securement of wheelchairs and emergency evacuation procedures.
