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LEADS CORNER

As you move into your third cycle of teacher observations, you are continuing to make advancements towards growing teachers to grow students. Keep in mind that observation data (SLTs, Observations, PGP/Coaching Plan) is placed into the Louisiana Evaluation System (LES), even if you are using a legacy system such as COMPASS. Collaborate with your LES system contact person to ensure that you are able to access the system. The <u>Guide for School Leaders: Planning for Implementation</u> is a continuous resource to support LEADS implementation.

Below are a few steps to continue a smooth transition to LEADS.

- School instructional leadership teams conduct trend analysis with observation data from the first and second cycles, identify strengths and growth opportunities, and determine next steps for the team's professional learning (i.e. extended LER indicator deep dives, connections to student work, etc.)
- For eligible educators, designated observers/evaluators of educators at each school conduct subsequent follow-up coaching and support cycle.

LEADS Resources

Resources continue to be added to the <u>LEADS Public Collections</u> section of the Professional Learning Platform. Two new modules to deepen understanding of the interconnectedness of the indicators of the Louisiana Educator Rubric are now available: <u>The Rubric is Holistic: Promoting Strong Academic Conversations</u> and The <u>LER is Holistic: Impact of Thinking and Problem Solving on Student Engagement</u>. There are now two <u>Full Length Lesson Sets</u> available. These sets include pre-conference, observation, post-conference, and PGP/coaching plan materials. The <u>Video Clip Collection</u>, which highlights classroom instructional best practices aligned to the Instructional Domain indicators of the <u>Louisiana Educator Rubric (LER)</u>, is also available.

These resources offer access to professional learning for system leaders, school leaders, teacher leaders, and teachers to support the advancement of classroom instruction and student learning. Louisiana educators can use these materials in various professional learning settings to deepen the knowledge of the LER, build rater reliability and a common language for the LER, and hone LER observation skills.

2025 LEADS Louisiana Evaluator Training
