The LDOE, in partnership with A+PEL, has developed monthly [professional learning modules](#) on topics critical to new teacher success. These modules comprise online asynchronous content, followed by an in-person learning lab where participants practice and apply the concepts.

LES Evaluations

School leaders should continue finalizing 2024–2025 educator evaluations in LES by selecting 2024 to complete any remaining data. Evaluations may be finalized, including VAM teachers. The data entry deadline will be announced after VAM results are released this fall. It is encouraged to collaborate with your LES system contact person for any incomplete evaluations. Refer to [Bulletin 130](#) for the criteria for marking an evaluation incomplete.

Round 1 observations should now be underway for 2025-2026 evaluations. SLT meetings and goal setting should have occurred, with evaluators reviewing and accepting SLTs in LES. The [LES Timeline](#) and [LES Technical Guide](#) serve as key resources to support ongoing tasks and data entry in LES.

Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) School Safety Training

Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) School Safety will host a [virtual training](#) on enhancing behavioral threat assessment and management (BTAM) practices in kindergarten through grade 12 (K-12) schools. The training will take place on Thursday, October 16, from 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm. CDT. This session will explore how K-12 leaders can build and strengthen BTAM processes that promote early intervention and prevent school violence, especially when embedded within a comprehensive multi-tiered system of supports. A panel of experts will share strategies for forming an effective BTAM team, defining roles, and fostering collaboration among school staff, mental health professionals, and law enforcement partners.

The new [Math Unit Study Tool](#) and [Lesson Preparation Protocol](#) support effective planning with HQIM. These tools guide teachers as they prepare by focusing on the most critical elements of each unit and lesson.

Using these tools, teachers can:

- Clarify learning goals related to the standards.
- Anticipate student misconceptions.

- Study how lessons connect within and across units.
- Highlight key tasks, questions, and strategies expected of all learners.

When used in teacher collaboration, the tool builds shared understanding among teachers, leading to more consistent and coherent instruction. Regular lesson preparation will improve pacing, engagement, and outcomes.
