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#### LEADS CORNER

As you continue your second/third cycle of teacher observations, you are continuing to make advancements towards growing teachers to grow students. Below are a few steps to continue a smooth transition to LEADS:

- School instructional leadership teams conduct trend analysis with observation data from the first and second cycles, identify strengths and growth opportunities, and determine next steps for the team's professional learning (i.e. extended LER indicator deep dives, connections to student work, etc.)
- For eligible educators, designated observers/evaluators of educators at each school conduct subsequent follow-up coaching and support cycle

Keep in mind that observation data is placed into the Louisiana Evaluation System (LES). Collaborate with your LES system contact person to ensure that you are able to access the system. The <u>Guide for School Leaders: Planning for Implementation</u> is a continuous resource to support LEADS implementation.

## **LEADS Implementation Planning Resources**

The 2025-2026 school year begins the full implementation of the Louisiana Educator Advancement and Development System (LEADS). The Educator Talent and Workforce Development Team has created guidance to support leaders with planning for LEADS evaluation implementation.

The <u>Evaluation Implementation Guidance for School Leaders</u> provides school leaders with a sequenced list of suggested activities to support smooth implementation. To qualify for the assessment, evaluators must attend all full, consecutive days. Evaluators are encouraged to register for earlier dates to allow time to reschedule if conflicts arise. (Those who have previously attended LER or LLCR training do not need to attend again; however, the certification assessment is an annual requirement. # Aspiring Principal Fellowship 2025-2026 Application Available

The Louisiana Department of Education is excited to offer the fifth cohort of the Aspiring Principal Fellowship for the 2025-2026 school year. This transformative fellowship will equip up to 50 individuals with the essential knowledge and skills to step into the principal role. Through this selective statewide program, aspiring school leaders will begin a unique year-long journey to elevate their leadership potential. Fellowship participants will collaborate throughout the year, exploring best practices with regional and national experts. They will engage in immersive full-day school visits, working hand-in-hand with exemplary practicing principals while participating in professional learning aligned with current state initiatives.

Applicants must hold or be eligible for a current EDL1 certification in Louisiana. School systems must cover the \$1,000 tuition for presenters and materials, as well as travel costs. Fellowship applicants will be notified of acceptance by May 9.

# **Adolescent Literacy Professional Learning Opportunity**

The literacy team is offering two full-day virtual trainings through Keys to Literacy on adolescent literacy.

<u>Advanced Word Study</u> is an all-day training that will be offered once in April and several days in early June. The training will focus on teaching advanced word study so that students can spell and read multisyllabic words in any subject.

Keys to Adolescent Literacy is a one-day training that will be offered on several dates in early June. This one-day training will offer an overview of adolescent literacy instruction for students in grades 5-12 in all subject areas, and will build background knowledge on how students learn to read, best practices for teaching content reading and writing skills, and common reasons why some older students struggle.
