LOSFA: Why Apply Day is September 20

LCAAM, in partnership with the American College Application Campaign under the ACT Center for Equity, is an initiative aimed at increasing the number of students applying to postsecondary institutions. Through this initiative, LOSFA offers support for college application events by providing representatives to assist with your event, resources for counselors to plan a college application event, and tools to help students through the college application process. The Louisiana College Application and Access Month (LCAAM) will be held this October, but events can be scheduled throughout the fall and spring semesters! Financial Literacy

Please share with secondary principals, assistant principals, and school counselors.

In accordance with <u>Bulletin 741 §2318 and §2319</u> every student entering grade 9 in 2024-2025 and beyond must successfully complete a one-unit <u>Financial Literacy</u> course (course code 160345) as a requirement for high school graduation. This course is designed to prepare students to make well-informed decisions regarding finances including debt management, building and improving credit, and practical financial decision-making. Students will apply fundamental math skills to compute income taxes, interest rates, and balance a checkbook.

- Students pursuing a **TOPS University diploma** will take Financial Literacy as a separate course. Financial Literacy will <u>not</u> count as a math credit.
- Students pursuing a TOPS Tech Career diploma will take Financial Literacy as a math credit.

2025-2026 FAFSA

Federal Student Aid announced that the 2025-2026 FAFSA® will be released on **December 1, 2024**, with full, end-to-end functionality. The outreach tools and resources that typically accompany the form will be released in advance, and FAFSA® processing will occur within one to three days of submission. If realized, this announcement means that the system will be fully functional for all students on December 1, 2024. **As a reminder, the graduation cohort of 2024-2025 and beyond are not required to complete the FAFSA as a part of their graduation checkout.**

Career Exploration in Middle Grades

R.S. 17:183.2 has been adopted to prepare students when choosing a career option at the high school level. This career option statute states that schools with grades 6-8 should incorporate activities that expose students to career, technical and academic fields of study. At least six activities should be conducted each school year, per grade level. Types of activities include field trips, guest speakers and career fairs.

Financial Aid Planning

The FAFSA <u>policy</u> has changed. The graduation cohort of 2024-2025 and beyond are not required to complete the FAFSA as a part of their graduation checkout. This policy change doesn't remove the requirement of local education agencies (LEAs) to provide students and their parents or guardians with information regarding financial aid programs to support postsecondary education and training. LEAs must ensure that each student receives adequate support in completing and submitting an application for financial aid. However, a student action related to FAFSA completion will not be required. An updated parent and student financial aid planning toolkit is available to school systems. Here are a few toolkits you can use.



- The "Be Ready" Counselor





- Save the Core Reference Tables for all three diploma paths (TOPS University TU, TOPS Tech Career - CA, and LAA1 - L1). These reports display the courses accepted in each diploma path and will assist counselors in reviewing transcripts and scheduling the Spring semester.
- Review summer school students and students who previously failed, then passed part of a course and connect the passing parts with "1" and "2" on their transcripts.
- Contact your system Data Manager and request an upload of grade 10 and grade 11 transcripts to STS by Friday, September 27 to ensure all courses are in STS.

- 2023-2024 courses can be uploaded to STS through September 30, 2024. Please connect with your district Data Manager to correct state transcripts.
