Mentor Credential Waiver Portal is OPEN

Since September 2020, every teacher who serves as the mentor of an undergraduate or post-baccalaureate candidate must hold the Mentor Certificate or the Provisional Mentor Ancillary Certificate. Prompted by a shortage of credentialed Mentor Teachers willing to host residents specifically in certain content areas, BESE has allowed a waiver of the Mentor Credential since the 2020-2021 school year.

This application process will be completed by system leads, mentors, principals, and, in the case of the Alternate Mentor Waiver, education preparation providers.

The portals for <u>Traditional Mentor Waivers</u> and <u>Alternate Mentor Waivers</u> opened on August 7, 2025.

The New Teacher Experience Professional Learning Modules

The LDOE, in partnership with A+PEL, has developed monthly <u>professional learning modules</u> on topics that are critical for new teacher success. These modules include online asynchronous content followed by an in-person learning lab where participants practice and apply these concepts.

Teachers are expected to complete the entire series of Professional Learning Modules. These five modules are designed to build learning throughout the year.

- Module 1: Classroom Management/Classroom Environment
- Module 2: Standards and Curriculum
- Module 3: Data Literacy
- Module 4: Literacy for 21st-Century Learners
- Module 5: Parent and Community Engagement

This year, complimentary seating will be offered for the first 200 registrants.



Half of the seats for the northern location (Monroe) and half for the southern location (Baton Rouge) will be reserved as complementary seating. Once those seats are exhausted, teachers may still attend, but the cost to complete the series of modules will be \$1,272.00 per teacher.

There are still complementary seats available.

Teachers must receive approval to attend from their school leader. <u>Registration</u> is now open. Once teachers complete the registration, participants will receive details on selected training locations and an invitation to access the online asynchronous modules.

Geaux Teach Scholarship Program

Act 463 of the 2022 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature established the Geaux Teach Program, which provides scholarships to students who are enrolled in teacher preparation programs at the state's postsecondary institutions that are approved by the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE). Funding is also available to students attending certified alternative teacher preparation programs approved by BESE.

Students may receive up to \$5,000 annually to cover the cost of tuition fees, textbooks, and instructional materials required for enrollment. Billing dates for the fall semester/term is November 1, the spring semester/term is May 1, and the summer semester/term is July 1, when applicable.

Spring 2026 Program Approval Cycle

The <u>new program application window</u> opened on **September 1** for the spring cycle for teacher preparation programs, mentor teacher, content leader, and early childhood ancillary certificates. All Notices of Intent are due by **October 1**. Program Approval Reminders

When considering a change to a program, email <u>believeandprepare@la.gov</u>. The preparation team will meet to determine whether the change is minor or major. If the change is minor, the change must be noted on the letterhead and signed by the dean. If the change is major, the provider must undergo the program approval process to obtain approval for the change. This process is crucial for candidates to obtain certification upon completing their coursework.

Fall LAER Recertification

The LAER <u>Annual Recertification</u> window is open in <u>EE PASS</u>. Recertification is required to continue evaluating aspiring educators. Recertification <u>EE PASS</u> will close **September 18**.

To complete the recertification assessment:

- Sign in to your **EE PASS** account.
- Refer to the Navigating <u>EE PASS 2.0 Teacher Evaluator Certification Assessment</u> document for guidance on accessing the LAER certification assessment.
- Once you have successfully passed the LAER recertification, download and save your Certificate of Completion for your records.

Specialized Dyslexia Training

A free dyslexia course is available that would fulfill the "specialized training" outlined in <u>Bulletin 996</u> for instructors teaching the dyslexia coursework.

Enrollment in Coursera's <u>Overcoming Dyslexia</u> is currently free and includes nine modules. These modules will focus on advancements in dyslexia research, federal statutes, and pedagogical methods for teaching students with dyslexia.
