Louisiana Student Standards for ELA and Math Review: Committee Applications Now Open

The LDOE will review the state's student standards for math and English language arts (ELA). The Louisiana Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) approved the review process during their December meeting and the <u>standards review committee's application</u> is now open. Louisiana teachers, administrators, school system staff, higher education faculty, parents, and community members are encouraged to apply. Participation requires attendance at regular in-person meetings in Baton Rouge scheduled from April 2025 through July 2025. Funding is available for participants traveling long distances.

All interested educators, parents, and community members should apply by 8 a.m. on January 27.
