LEADS

Nearly three years ago, the LDOE surveyed over 8,000 teachers and school leaders on how to improve the state's educator evaluation system. Using that feedback, the newly redesigned Louisiana's Educator Advancement and Development System (LEADS) was created to address the most pressing concerns and desires of our education community. Key elements of the LEADS system include:

- Creating a more customized approach to follow-up coaching in which effective educators are rewarded with fewer observations and educators new to the profession or those struggling can receive the immediate instructional support they need
- Offering more useful, timely, and actionable feedback
- Connecting learning opportunities directly to specific measures found on educator evaluations
- Providing administrators additional time to spend with educators most in need
- Streamlining evaluations and promoting career advancement

In the 2023-2024 school year, the LEADS program was piloted at 16 schools across the state and the feedback of those participating educators was used to make additional improvements. Now, as we enter our final learning year, we will again look to the education community to help us finalize the program prior to the 2025-2026 launch.

Third Grade Promotion Act Guidance

Guidance is now available for <u>Third Grade Promotion</u> in the Literacy Library. It is important to include families in communication regarding Act 422. The <u>Third Grade Promotion Flier</u> and the <u>Third Grade Promotion Family Letter</u> should be sent home with the beginning of the year paperwork. The family letter requires a parent's signature

and ensures documentation that third-grade families in traditional public schools were notified of the new Third Grade Promotion Act regarding literacy.

Steve Carter Tutoring Program

The Steve Carter Literacy Program provides \$1,500 vouchers to families of eligible K-12 public school students per school year. The digital vouchers can be used to purchase high-quality literacy and math tutoring to be held after school hours, in-person or virtually. Families will apply through the Steve Carter Tutoring parent portal and, if approved, will select an approved tutoring provider.

Math Leader Toolkit

The <u>Math Leader Toolkit</u> was developed to support math teachers and leaders in their transition to the <u>Louisiana Educator Advancement Development System (LEADS)</u>. The math team at the Louisiana Department of Education collaborated with NIET to create this toolkit of resources to build connections to the new LEADS rubric while keeping high-quality instructional materials, student, and teacher needs at the forefront.

The Math Leader Toolkit is comprised of:

- the Student Work Analysis Process to aid teachers in using student work to identify needs and reflect on instructional practices,
- the Student Work Analysis Coaching Tool to aid instructional coaches, master teachers, and other instructional support staff in supporting classroom teachers through the Student Work Analysis process,
- the **Content Specific Framework for Leaders** to aid administrators in supporting coaches, instructional support staff, and teachers through the Student Work Analysis Process and Coaching Tools, and
- the **Acceleration Program Appraisal** to reflect on current math programming in all contexts to identify and adjust for misalignments.

EDUCATOR OPPORTUNITIES

Educational Leadership Alternative Pathway 4 LDOE Training

The Educational Leadership (EDL) Alternative Pathway 4 offers a unique opportunity for current MPA, MBA, or JD holders, and honorably discharged commissioned officers from the US military to obtain an Educational Leadership Certificate. To be eligible, candidates must complete training provided by the LDOE and have passed either the School Leadership Licensure Assessment or the Louisiana Leadership Assessment Series. For the 2024-2025 academic year, interested applicants should complete the application.

The pathway requirements state that candidates must be provided a mentor to support their induction and transition into the Educational Leadership role. The LDOE is currently seeking mentors to support these candidates. Any current school/system leaders interested in serving as a mentor for novice principals are encouraged to complete the mentor application by **October 25**.

Educator Certification Resources and Updates to Online Certification Portal

<u>Certification Bulletin, Bulletin 746</u> and the <u>Online Teacher Certification Portal, Teach LA Live!</u> Support educators in maintaining their certification.

The online certification portal allows educators to submit certification applications (where allowed in policy), or connect with a Certification Specialist to <u>ask questions</u>. Current application processing time is approximately 15-25 business days. Question responses are provided via email in approximately 3-5 business days. The portal question and application system will be redesigned and implemented in phases. Phase 1 includes the updating of the question submission system. The testing window occurred this summer and full implementation is set for August. End users will need a <u>MyLa account</u> to submit questions in the new system.
