Hello, fellow educators! I am Tessa Cay Bryant Flournoy, the Principal of Brown Upper Elementary School in Webster Parish. I am also a Dyscalculia Interventionist and LDOE Certified Math Content Leader. I am overjoyed to be a part of the development of the first numeracy screener in Louisiana with other math educators across the state. The Numeracy Screener Assessment Committee's student-centered conversations are expected to have a lasting impact.

The mastery of numeracy skills is equally important as literacy for students. The Numeracy Screener intends to progressively check the pulse of mastery of foundational and important numeracy skills within grades K-3 at the beginning, middle, and end of the school year. As an advocate for math esteem and

dyscalculia awareness, I understand the importance of early identification of student strengths and areas for growth. This allows teachers and interventionists to plan effective interventions and pinpoint students who may require additional screening for disabilities and learning differences, setting students up for success early on. This pioneering initiative can help close the achievement gap for students across the state.

I am hopeful that the response to numeracy screening will lead to accelerated math learning similar to the reading revival that we have seen in the past few years in Louisiana. During this learning year of the Numeracy Screener, educators can look forward to providing feedback on the administration of the assessment. I encourage all educators to read the Numeracy Screener FAQ to find more information about the Numeracy Screener. Every teacher plays a vital role in student success, and knowing the purpose of the Numeracy Screener helps us move students forward together.
