Defining The Purpose

- **Focus**: LDOE Attendance Strategy
- **Purpose**: To cultivate a knowledgeable network of attendance stakeholders to create and support attendance teams who implement evidence-based best practices and resources to improve student attendance.

Attendance Data Management

- Collection, Analysis, and Goal Setting
 - Establish a strategic data collection process to allow for insightful analysis.
 - Analyze data to identify students who require attendance support.
 - Establish data-informed goals for attendance improvement.
- **Progress Monitoring**
 - Monitor attendance data and intervention effectiveness to ensure continuous improvement.



























Is Student Attendance Improving Month by Month?

Attendance Guidance - Vulnerable Student Groups

How to identify vulnerable student groups

Examine connections between attendance issues and academic performance, disciplinary actions, or other challenges. Students struggling academically or facing frequent suspensions may develop attendance avoidance behaviors.

Examples of vulnerable student groups may include:

- Students with a history of truancy and/or chronic absenteeism
- Students experiencing housing instability and homelessness
- Students in foster care or frequent placement changes
- Students with chronic health conditions
- Students with language challenges



Attendance Guidance - Vulnerable Student Groups

Analyze Attendance Data Patterns

Review attendance records to identify students with chronic absenteeism (missing 10% or more of school days), frequent tardiness, or declining attendance trends. Use data analytics tools to spot patterns across demographics, grade levels, and time periods.

Attendance Guidance - Vulnerable Student Groups

How to Support High-Risk Demographics

Conduct Regular Outreach and Assessments

Implement systematic check-ins with families, conduct home visits when appropriate, and use early warning systems to flag students showing initial signs of attendance decline. Partner with community organizations to understand external factors affecting attendance.



Identifying Attendance Barriers

Reason for Absences	Possible Interventions	
Food Insecurity	 Provide breakfast after the bell Engage with local food bank 	
Housing Instability	 Access to a uniform closet Collaborate with local support agencies 	
Academically Behind/Learning Loss	 Utilize individualized student support plans Provide academic enrichment opportunities Identify learning gaps and provide academic interventions 	
Language Barriers	 Provide targeted academic support Increase parental outreach Connect with specialized services 	
Instructional Disconnect	 Facilitate skillful implementation of HQIM Connect instruction with academic enrichments Provide opportunities for participation in work-based learning 	
Lack of Belonging	 Encourage engagement in after-school activities Promote positive student-teacher interactions Connect students with a mentor 	

Effective progress monitoring is essential for evaluating the impact of attendance strategies and ensuring that interventions are implemented successfully. It involves the ongoing collection and analysis of attendance data to track progress toward goals and make data-informed adjustments.

Measure Tier-Specific Intervention Fidelity

Assess implementation quality at each tier through classroom observations, intervention logs, and surveys. Track adherence to protocols, dosage of interventions delivered, and rates to ensure each tier operates as designed across all district schools.

Track Student Movement Between Tiers

Monitor how students progress through Tier 1 (universal, proactive supports), Tier 2 (targeted early interventions), and Tier 3 (comprehensive individualized supports). Document entry/exit criteria, time spent in each tier, and percentage of students successfully moving to lower tiers or maintaining improved attendance.

Conduct Quarterly System Reviews

Host district-wide meetings with school teams to review aggregate tier data, share best practices, and adjust program components. Examine resource allocation, staffing needs, and systemic barriers while celebrating schools showing strong tier implementation and student outcomes.
