

### **Session Description**

- School system and Law enforcement leaders will provide information on how to build and strengthen relationships that provide safety and security measures for school systems.
- Participants will collaborate on the development of effective plans for continuity of operations when emergency situations arise.



#### **Description of Rapides Parish**

- Second largest parish in the state: 1,318 square land miles (<u>Vernon is 1st</u>)
- Approximately 130,000 Residents
- At least 21 different cities, towns, communities, etc
- At least 11 different law enforcement agencies in the parish
- Approximately 22,000 students
- 42 schools and 3 programs
- One School Resource Officer per school /program



# **History of SROs In Rapides Parish**

- The sales tax was passed in October of 2002. After Columbine in 1999, Sheriff Hilton had the vision to put a Deputy Sheriff in every school. To fund this endeavor, he asked the public for a ½ cent sales to fund the SRO program and for raises for employees as well as equipment.
- After the start of the sales tax, deputies and police officers from other agencies applied for the 60 positions.
- Currently we have deputies assigned to 57 schools, 3 SRO supervisors, 4 fill in SRO's that respond to abscesses, a secretary and a School Safety Liaison assigned full time to the Rapides Parish School Board for threat assessments and as a go between in critical incidents at any school campus.
