

June 2016 BESE Summary

The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) met last Tuesday and Wednesday, June 21 and 22. A summary of board actions that directly impact the activities of local education agencies are listed below.

Any bulletin revisions, with the exception of emergency rules, must run in the Louisiana Register as a Notice of Intent for 90 days and complete the rulemaking process before becoming rule and appearing in the bulletins on the BESE website. Revisions to Bulletin 140, Louisiana Early Childhood Care and Education Network, to update language based on results from the 2015 – 2016 academic learning year

The Board approved revisions to Bulletin 140, Louisiana Early Childhood Care and Education Network, related to lead agency responsibilities, coordinated enrollment, and the unified quality rating and improvement system.

Approval of a plan regarding the review of academic content standards in science

Louisiana Revised Statute 17:24.4 requires BESE to develop state academic content standards for required subjects to be taught in Louisiana public elementary and secondary schools. At last week's meeting, BESE approved a plan for the review of academic content standards in science. The review process will commence during the summer of 2016 and conclude with a recommendation to BESE in March 2017. The board will approve the final membership of the review committees in August.

Approval of course providers for the Course Choice Program for 2016-2017

In accordance with state law, the Louisiana Department of Education (LDE) released a Request for Applications (RFA) for the Course Choice Program. The 2015-2016 RFA process represents a fourth call for course providers. This year, the LDE implemented a "rolling applications" process for course providers. This new process enables the LDE to accept Course Choice course provider applications throughout the year.

At last week's meeting, the LDE recommended three course provider applicants for Board approval based on successful completion of the three specified Course Choice evaluation phases (i.e., Application, Interview, and Independent Panel Review).

Approval of Allocations

The Board approved fifteen allocations of funding to local school systems at last week's meeting, including: Believe and Prepare – Early Childhood awards, Early Childhood lead agency awards, funding to increase student achievement in literacy, funding to support dropout prevention and workforce preparation for at-risk youth, funding to support teachers in publicly-funded child care classrooms, and funding to support positive behavioral interventions and supports (PBIS) programs.
