Discussion Topic 1

- ❖ Where are they located in the building / on the campus?
- ❖ What differences are there, if any, between PreK and Kindergarten in the way that teachers arrange the rooms?
- *What differences are there, if any, between PreK and Kindergarten in staffing and scheduling?


Discussion Topic 2

Consider the learning experience for preK and kindergarten children.

- ❖ What do you think is different for children when they transition from home or a small childcare center to PreK class at your school? When they move from the PreK 4 program to Kindergarten at your school?
- What are the efforts undertaken at your school to support these transitions?
- ❖ Do these transitions provide an opportunity for PreK and Kindergarten teachers to collaborate?
- ❖ Does your school collaborate with private preschools or Head Start to support transition to PreK?
