

Purpose of Setting the Context


Setting the context of substantive topics provide students with

Teaching Notes

10 min

Purposefully pair students with similar levels of language proficiency.

Give students an overview of the Wonderstruck unit structure.

Explain that students will read several texts and build their knowledge, skills, and habits as they explore the central question.

If students need support during the activity:

- · Provide direct support or examples.
 - As needed, have students create their own questions about the unit goal.




