
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


## **Zoom Meeting Preparation**



## **Ready to Achieve 2022-2023 Operational Guidance**

The <u>Ready to Achieve 2022-2023 Operational Guidance</u>, developed by the Louisiana Department of Health, can help K-12 school and ECE program administrators support safe, in-person learning for K-12 schools, and keep ECE programs open, while managing the spread of COVID-19. Based on <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Community Levels</u>, this guidance provides flexibility so schools and ECE programs can adapt to changing local situations, including periods of increased community health impacts from COVID-19.



# Louisiana Department of Health Guidance for All Community Levels

- Anyone with COVID-19 symptoms, regardless of vaccination status, should be tested for COVID-19.
  - If a **rapid antigen test is negative**, a symptomatic person should seek confirmatory PCR testing.
  - If **confirmatory testing is negative**, they can return to school as long as they meet return-to-school requirements (e.g., 24-hours fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medication)
  - If **confirmatory testing is positive**, the symptomatic person has COVID-19 and should complete at-home isolation.
- Anyone who tests positive by viral test (antigen or PCR) for COVID-19, regardless of vaccination status, should complete <u>at-home isolation</u>.
- Anyone who is identified as a close contact to a COVID-19 case should follow the appropriate masking/quarantine guidance.



# Louisiana Department of Health Guidance for All Community Levels

#### Personal Hygiene and Sanitation Recommendations:

- Teach and reinforce proper handwashing hygiene. Students and staff should wash hands frequently throughout the day.
- Take additional steps to increase outdoor air intake and improve air filtration.
- Teach and reinforce covering coughs and sneezes to prevent the spread of infectious diseases.
- Clean surfaces at least once a day to prevent the spread of germs.
- If an area has a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 24 hours, that area should be <u>cleaned and disinfected</u>.
- Schools can consider screening testing for high-risk activities such as indoor sports and extracurricular activities.

# Louisiana Department of Health Guidance for Medium or High COVID Community Levels

#### Current Louisiana Department of Health Masking Recommendations:

- High COVID-19 Community Level:
  - Universal indoor mask use is recommended at a high COVID-19 Community Level and when experiencing a COVID-19 outbreak.
- Medium COVID-19 Community Level:
  - People who are immunocompromised or at risk for getting very sick with COVID-19 should talk to their healthcare provider about the need to wear a mask.
- Schools can also choose to implement universal masking at any COVID-19 Community Level. Anyone who
  chooses to wear a mask should be supported in their decision to do so at any COVID-19 Community Level,
  including low.

#### Screening Testing:

• Schools can implement screening testing at any COVID-19 Community Level, but should especially be considered at medium and high COVID-19 Community Levels

# Louisiana Department of Health Guidance for Medium or High COVID Community Levels

#### Cohorting:

- In areas with a <u>high COVID-19 community level</u>, cohorting can be used to limit the number of people who come in contact with each other.
- In areas with a <u>high COVID-19 community level</u>, school systems can also discourage crowding indoors to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19.

#### High-Risk Activities:

- Indoor sports, close contact sports and indoor extracurricular activities may put participants at an increased risk for getting and spreading the virus that causes COVID-19.
- Schools and ECE programs may consider temporarily stopping these activities to control a school or program-associated outbreak, or during periods of high COVID-19 Community Level.

## **K-12 COVID Outbreak Guidance**

- K-12 schools should report weekly aggregate case counts and core group outbreaks to the <u>LDH COVID-19 Reporting Portal</u>.
- If school systems need to be enrolled in the LDH COVID-19 Reporting Portal, information on how to do so can be found in the <u>LDH School Reporting Guidelines</u>.
- Early Care and Education (ECE) programs should report outbreaks to their regional epidemiologist.


## **K-12 COVID Outbreak Definitions**

**Core Group Outbreak:** at least three student, teacher, or staff cases within specified core group with symptom onset or positive test result within 14 days of each other, AND NO likely known exposure to a case outside of the school setting (e.g., household)

**Core group:** a core group includes but is not limited to extracurricular activity, classroom, cohort group, before/after school care, etc.

**School-wide outbreak:** 5% or more students, teachers, and staff with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 over a 14-day period.

**Outbreak conclusion:** an outbreak is considered over when there have been 14 days without new cases



## **K-12 COVID Outbreak Guidance**

Use the below tool for each core group where multiple cases have been identified to determine if you have an outbreak(s).

DETERMINING IF YOU HAVE AN OUTBREAK IN A CORE GROUP		
Question	Response	Interpretation
<ol> <li>How many cases have been identified in the core group?</li> </ol>		<ul> <li>If 3 or more cases, continue to question 2.</li> <li>If less than 3 cases, this is not an outbreak.</li> </ul>
2. Do cases have a symptom onset or positive test result within 14 days of each other?	O Yes O No	<ul> <li>If no, remove the cases that don't meet this criterion from your case count.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>3. Do any of the cases have a known exposure to a case outside of the school setting?</li> <li>(Note: if exposure to another case outside of the school setting is unknown, the case should be counted toward the school-associated outbreak.)</li> </ul>	O Yes O No	<ul> <li>If yes, remove from your case count the cases with exposure outside of the school setting.</li> </ul>
4. After removing cases that don't meet the criteria in questions 2 and 3, are there still at least 3 cases in the core group?	O Yes O No	<ul> <li>If yes, this is a Core group outbreak.</li> <li>If no, this is not considered a Core group outbreak.</li> </ul>

# **School System Operations Plan Submission**

A school system that receives ARP ESSER funds must make publicly available on its website a **Ready to Achieve! plan** for safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services. School systems can meet this requirement for 2022-23 by updating their Ready to Achieve 2021 plans to reflect the <u>Ready to Achieve 2022-2023</u> guidance.

School systems will submit a link to their plan to LDOE no later than September 12.
