Financial Aid Planning

The FAFSA policy has changed. The graduation cohort of 2024-2025 and beyond are not required to complete the FAFSA as a part of their graduation checkout. This policy change doesn't remove the requirement of local education agencies (LEAs) to provide students and their parents or guardians with information regarding financial aid programs to support postsecondary education and training. LEAs must ensure that each student receives adequate support in completing and submitting an application for financial aid. However, a student action related to FAFSA completion will not be required. Financial Literacy

In accordance with <u>Bulletin 741 §2318 and §2319</u> every student entering grade 9 in 2024-2025 and beyond must successfully complete a one-unit <u>Financial Literacy</u> course (course code 160345) as a requirement for high school graduation. This course is designed to prepare students to make well-informed decisions regarding finances including debt management, building and improving credit, and practical financial decision-making. Students will apply fundamental math skills to compute income taxes, interest rates, and balance a checkbook.

Students pursuing a TOPS University diploma will take Financial Literacy as a separate course. Financial Literacy will <u>not</u> count as a math credit.

Students pursuing a TOPS Tech Career diploma will take Financial Literacy as a math credit.

Career Development Fund End-of-Year Reporting

The 2023-2024 Career Development Fund (CDF) End of Year Expenditure Report is available for school systems to complete. The deadline to report on 2023-2024 CDF expenditures is August 31. Schools systems should reference the 2023-2024 Guidelines for Use of CDF Allocation when completing the form.

CDF funds support increased student access to high-value Career and Technical Education courses and training. CDF funds are 6% of the MFP State and Local Base Cost Per Pupil (\$241) provided for each qualifying student course enrollment in grades 9-12.
