2025-2026 Graduate Diploma and Seal Orders

The <u>Diploma and Seal Order Form</u> is now open to request diplomas and seals for 2026 high school graduates.

The electronic form should be submitted by Friday, February 6, 2026.

Only one form should be submitted for each school system. The Department of Education will cover the cost of the initial order and distribution.

Each school system should order 10% over the number of diplomas needed. This overage will take care of misprints, late enrolled students, etc.

Community Service Diploma Endorsement

Students have the opportunity to earn 80 hours of community service during their high school years and earn the **Community Service Diploma Endorsement**.

America 250 Diploma Endorsement

America 250 is a national initiative created by Congress to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States in 2026.

Each state, including Louisiana, has established its own commission to plan meaningful programs, recognitions, and events that honor America's past and inspire its future.

The America 250 seal will appear on diplomas for Louisiana public high school graduates in 2026. This emblem honors the nation's founding and the importance of preparing informed, engaged citizens.

Civics Diploma Endorsement

The 2025–2026 school year marks the first time students are eligible to earn the <u>Freedom Framework Diploma Endorsement</u>, a new recognition for high school students who demonstrate excellence in civics education.

The endorsement is awarded to students who score Mastery or above on the LEAP 2025 civics assessment. Recipients will receive an additional seal on their diploma and wear a red, white, and blue honor cord during graduation ceremonies.

- Work to identify special considerations needed by military-connected students and families
- Develop training to inform teachers and other school personnel of those special considerations
- Create a dedicated page on its website featuring resources for military-connected students and families
- Create a student-led transition program to provide peer support for military-connected students
