Problems with Family Engagement

- Families of chronically absent students often experience "information gaps."
- They are unaware their child's attendance is problematic.
- According to Everyday Labs, 78 percent of families with chronically absent children don't know how to obtain additional support.
- Families don't believe absences negatively impact their child, especially if the absence is excused.



Reframing Family Engagement

- Families are our partners.
 - Partners communicate regularly and share information.
 - Partners have trust and are allies.
- Families are the expert on their own child.
 - They can tell you their child's strengths and challenges.
 - They know background information that doesn't always make it into a folder.

Reframing Family Engagement

- Regular asset-based communication is needed.
 - Supportive tone.
 - Timely information.
 - In families home language.
- Assess needs and respond.
 - Basic needs addressed immediately.
 - Referral for continuous support with basic needs.
 - Connect with community partners.



Family Engagement: A Strategic Approach

- Who do we need to become?
- Family needs assessments are key.
 - Needs that may contribute to absenteeism can be addressed early.
 - This is how interventions are created.
- School has to be a welcoming place for students and families.

Family Engagement: A Strategic Approach

- Students and families must feel like they belong.
 - Are you creating opportunities for families to truly partner with schools?
 - Are you inclusive of families that can't make engagement events?
- Families must have a voice.
 - Are you polling families for insight?
 - Are you creating opportunities for two-way communication?



Family Engagement: A Strategic Approach

- More than a one-time event.
- More than focusing on one specific member.
- More than truancy letters.
- More than negative phone calls home.
